



According to the Tennessee Highway Patrol shortly after 7am Thursday Sgt. Chris Jenkins was dispatched to a call of a ladder in the roadway on Interstate 75. The Sgt. conducted a rolling roadblock to slow traffic down until he reached the ladder. At the time he reached the ladder he stopped in his vehicle and other vehicles came to a stop and while attempting to remove the ladder a tractor trailer didn't

stop and crashed into the two other vehicles and then into Sgt. Jenkins vehicle and hit the Sgt. as well killing him.

The ladder had apparently fell from another vehicle and had already been hit by other vehicles when the call to dispatch was made. THP is handling the investigation and a blood draw is being conducted on the truck driver. Authorities are also looking for the person who dropped the ladder from their vehicle.

Sgt. Jenkins has served

the Sheriff's Department since 2002 and was one of the best K9 handlers in the country receiving numerous awards over the years and was even featured on TV news stations during his tenure. His son, Clay is a deputy with the department and the two had just made an arrest for drugs just days before.

Burglary

William Jenkins, 46, Powel Avenue Sweetwater, was charged with Theft of Property, and Aggravated Burglary.

Deputy Eric Curtis LCSO, responded to Steekee Creek Rd in Loudon, TN for a past burglary. Upon arrival, Deputy made contact with the victim and complainant. He showed Deputy the interior of the home, which had been ransacked. There were muddy boot prints on the back door, but it remained intact. A window on the front porch had the screen pulled off of it. The basement garage door had the locking bar bent out of the way. The victim had a collection of three white Yi security cameras that were taken from the residence as well as a Mossberg 835 shotgun, a Hypertherm plasma cutter with commercial oxyacetylene tanks, and a 50inch television of unknown make with an accompanying

soundbar. The first 10 seconds of the video showed a blue early 2000's model Ford truck, four-door with an Eddie Bauer trim, enter the driveway slowly at 15:03 on 01/10/2022. Another 10-second video was recorded at 15:58 of the truck entering the driveway again, and an interior camera caught 10 seconds of a white male dressed in a hoodie and blue jeans forcing the garage door to the basement open and begin taking items from the floor. The victim did not recognize the vehicle or the male seen in the video and stated that he would have a more complete listing of the stolen items at a later time. Deputy contacted Lt. C Cosner 940 and informed him of the burglary. The Mossberg 835 was entered into NCIC on 01/11/2021 at approximately 2355, NIC: G035515508, After an investigation William Jenkins was charged. This did occur in Loudon County, TN.

According to documents filed in court and witness testimony, from November 2017 through February 2020, defendant transported child pornography in interstate commerce and possessed child pornography. Canady used social media websites to communicate with others to trade links of child pornography. Canady used multiple phones, 15 email addresses and 14 usernames to transport and collect the child pornography. In Canady's possession were found 640 images and 153 videos of child pornography, including sadistic depictions portraying infants and toddlers engaged in sexually explicit conduct. Canady had been paroled in June 2015 after approximately 12

years on a 40-year sentence for facilitation to commit felony murder and two counts of attempted aggravated robbery.

The criminal indictment was the result of an investigation by the Department of Homeland Security, Homeland Security Investigations, and Knoxville Police Department's Internet Crimes Against Children unit.

Assistant United States Attorney Jennifer Kolman represented the United States in court.

This case was brought as part of Project Safe Childhood (PSC), a nationwide initiative launched in May 2006, by the Department of Justice to combat the growing epidemic of child sexual exploitation and abuse. Led by the United States Attorney's Offices and the Criminal Division's Child

Exploitation and Obscenity Section, PSC marshals federal, state, and local resources to locate, apprehend, and prosecute individuals who sexually exploit children, and to identify and rescue victims.



Vanessa Fritts, 38, Senic stance Hill Lane Lenoir City, was was then found on the driver charged with Violation of Probation, Mfg/Del/Sale/ or Poss. Of Meth, and Man/Sell/Del/ Resale Sch. II.

Deputy Clay Jenkins LCSO, assisted Deputy Conner Amburn on a traffic stop at 1204 Hwy 321 (Bimbos) on a white from inside of Ms. Fritt's per-Chevy Malibu TN registration 631VYK after Deputy Amburn observed a registration violation. Deputy then spoke to the passenger Vanessa Fritts who was then found to have an active warrant out of Loudon County for Violation of Probation (docket #2020-CR-1021 C2), confirmed through dispatch. Deputy then asked Ms. Fritts if she had anything illegal on her she said she had heroin inside of her vagina. Deputy then asked the driver of the vehicle to search the vehicle to which she agreed.

A pink plastic baggy with .5 grams of a crystal-like sub-(methamphetamine) side floorboard which Vanessa Fritts took ownership of. She was then taken into custody and transported to the Loudon County Jail without incident. At the jail, 1.6 grams of brown powder residue was retrieved son. Narcotics Inv. M. Stanley then responded to test both substances with the TruNarc. Scan #1381 tested positive for meth as Scan #1386 tested positive for Fentanyl Compound.
