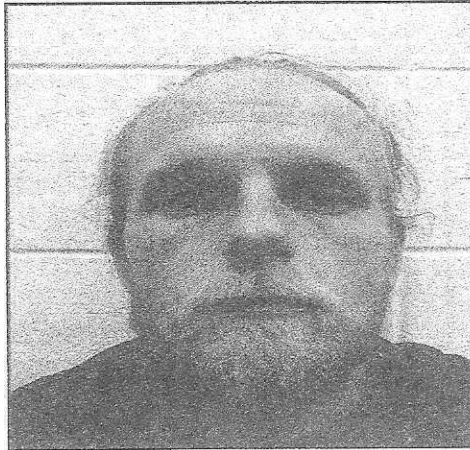

## Local Man Sonny Beason Charged After Ladder Loss Leads to Death of Sgt. Chris Jenkins

The Tennessee Highway Patrol announced the arrest of Sonny Beason, 35, of Loudon County on Monday night.

Beason was arrested and charged as the result of the ongoing investigation into the death of Loudon County Sheriff's Office Sergeant Chris Jenkins, according to officials.

On Feb. 3, Sgt. Chris Jenkins was removing a fallen ladder on I-75 in Loudon

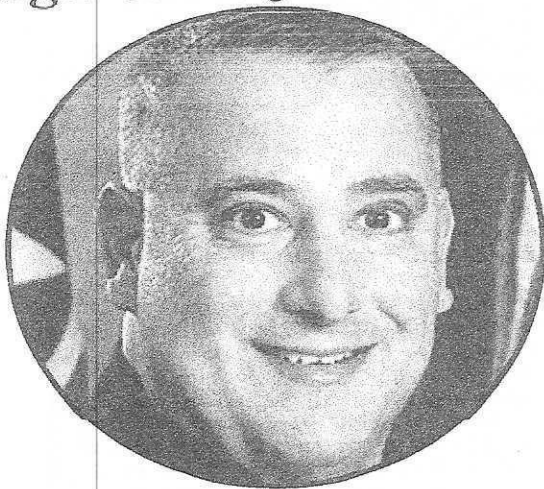

## Knoxville Man Convicted Of Federal Firearms Violation

On February 4, 2022, Kelvon Foster, 22, of Knoxville, pleaded guilty to a one-count Information charging Foster with making false or fictitious statements in connection with the purchase of a firearm in violation of Title 18, United States Code, Section 922(a)(6). Violations of that statutory provision are

sometimes referred to informally as "straw purchasing." Sentencing has been set for June 30, 2022, before United States District Judge Katherine A. Crytzer.

Foster faces a term of up to 10 years imprisonment, \$250,000 in fines and up to three years on supervised release.

As part of the plea agreement filed with

the Court on December 16, 2021, Foster waived an indictment by a Federal Grand Jury and agreed to plead guilty to the aforementioned charges. Foster admitted to purchasing firearms from a Federal Firearm's Licensee in Knoxville, Tennessee, on behalf of people prohibited by federal

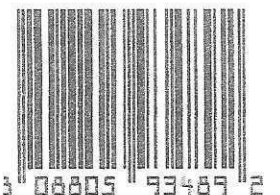

County when he was hit and killed by a tractor-trailer driven by Christopher Savannah of Houston, who is being held in custody on a \$1 million bond. Savannah who is also accused of killing Loudon County sergeant didn't have a proper CDL license, THP reported

THP reported Beason was driving a white utility truck carrying an unsecured orange fiberglass ladder in the bed of the truck.

Various drivers called in af-

ter the ladder came out of the truck and blocked part of I-75 NB near mile marker 73, according to THP. Two different vehicles hit the ladder before Jenkins could respond.

Officials said Jenkins used his cruiser as a rolling roadblock before coming to a stop to remove the ladder when he was hit and killed by the tractor-trailer driven by Savannah.

THP further reported Beason was identified by its Criminal Investigation Division with help from agents with the General Rus-

sell Johnson's 9th District Crimes Task Force and other local agencies using a citizen tip and other investigative methods.

Beason has been charged with driving on a suspended driver's license and three counts of misdemeanor reckless endangerment, according to THP. His bond was set at \$8,500 and he was taken to the Monroe County Jail.

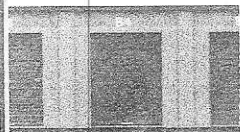

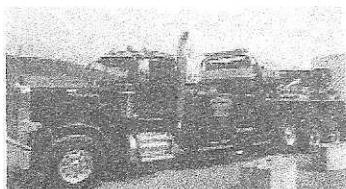

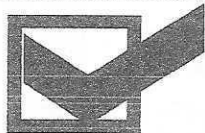

law from purchasing firearms. Foster further admitted that he purchased at least one of the firearms, a Glock pistol, on behalf of a juvenile, Anthony Thompson. The Glock pistol was later recovered by law enforcement in connection with an officer-involved shooting of Thompson at Austin-East Magnet High School on April 12, 2021.

United States Attorney Francis M. Hamilton III of the Eastern District of Tennessee, Resident Agent in Charge Keith Jordan of the ATF's Knoxville Field Office, and Director David Rausch of the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation made the announcement.

This prosecution is the result of an investigation by the ATF and the TBI. The United States Attorney's Office wishes to thank the Knox County Attorney General's Office for its support of this federal investigation.

This case was brought as part of Project Safe Neighborhoods (PSN), a comprehensive national strategy that creates local partnerships with law enforcement agencies to effectively enforce existing gun laws. It provides more options to prosecutors, allowing them to utilize local, state, and federal laws to ensure that criminals who commit gun crime face tough sentences. PSN gives each federal district the flexibility it needs to focus on individual challenges that a specific community face.

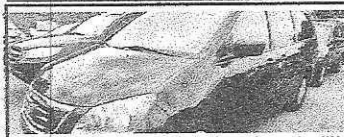

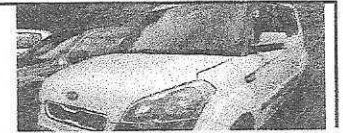

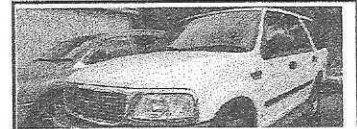

Henry Wunschel, 61, Geya Circle New York, was charged with DUI, Violation of Implied Consent, and Evading Arrest.

Deputy L. Hawkins LCSO, was dispatched to the area of Highway 444 in reference to a reckless driver. The caller was Kamron Kelly, Loudon City Police Officer 6Z5. He advised a silver Toyota 4Runner was driving all over the roadway nearly striking vehicles in the opposing lane. The vehicle continued down Highway 444 driving off the right side of the roadway in the grass. When the vehicle turned onto Toqua road, it came to a stop. Officer Kelley made contact with the driver, he advised it was a male driver and that he appeared intoxicated. The vehicle drove off from Officer Kelley.

At that time Deputy Hawkins had visual of the vehicle. It could not maintain its lane, driving off the roadway to the right, back onto the roadway into the other lane several times. Deputy attempted to conduct a traffic stop and it failed to yield and continued to travel down Toqua Road.

The vehicle then made a right turn onto Gaya Circle, still failing to yield. I observed that the drivers window was lowered, while still in transit Deputy gave commands to the driver to stop his vehicle through his Patrol Vehicle PA system. It continued to flee. The vehicle swerved several times while traveling down Gaya Circle, driving into the ditch line and onto multiple residential properties. At Gaya Circle the vehicle came to a stop. Deputy then gave commands to the driver to exit his vehicle. He rolled the window up. Deputy then gave more commands, he exited the vehicle and Deputy placed him into custody. The driver was

Henry Wunschel, he could not keep his balance while standing still, had bloodshot eyes, the odor of an alcoholic beverage was coming from his person, and was confused claiming he did not know Deputy was attempting to pull him over. Deputy asked him if he had been drinking this evening and he replied, "oh yeah." Deputy then read him The Miranda Rights. He refused to preform S.F.S.T. Deputy asked, "How much have you had to drink this evening?" he replied, "More than he should have." Deputy asked, "Do you think you were too drunk to be driving?" He replied, "Probably." He was read The Tennessee Blood and/or Breath Consent advisement, he refused to provide a sample. Dep. S. Mills conducted a vehicle inventory and found one 375 ml "Smirnoff" 100 proof vodka bottle in the front passengers seat completely empty. Under the front passengers seat was an empty 750 ml "Burnett's" 100 proof vodka bottle.

Deputy showed the empty "Smirnoff" bottle to Mr. Wunschel and asked "Is this what you were drinking?" and he replied, "Yes." Based on his training and experience, Mr. Wunschel's actions and statements, Deputy believed him to be under the influence.

He was transported to The Loudon County Jail. All the above did occur in Loudon County, Tennessee.

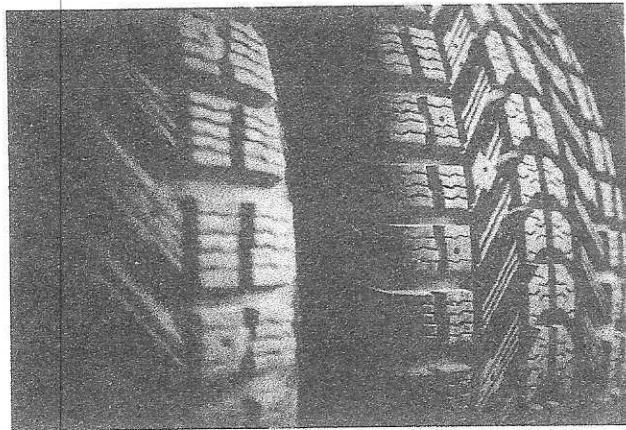

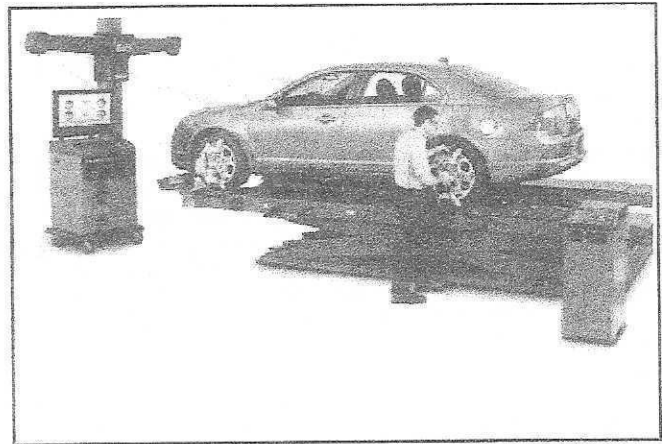

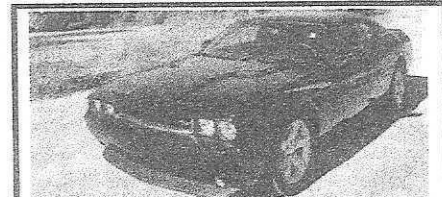
