hicle (gear shifter).

Based on my training and experience the small bag that Officer visually noticed near the gear shifter of the vehicle is commonly associated with narcotic usage. Officer requested for Deputy Gray and his K9 partner Kora to respond to my location to conduct an open-air sniff of the vehicle. While conducting business in regards to writ-

ing a citation, Deputy Gray and K9 Kora responded and conducted an open-air sniff of the exterior of the vehicle.

Officer was notified by Deputy Gray that K9 Kora positively alerted to an odor of narcotics coming from inside of the vehicle. A probable cause search of the vehicle was conducted. Located inside of the purse that belonged to SCHOP-FER which was in the back seat contained (1.49 Grams)

of a crystal-like substance that tested positive for methamphetamine through TRU NARC. (2) hypodermic needles, (3) empty "dime bags" that matched the one visually located during the initial traffic stop, (1) cut straw, (1) digital scale and (1) spoon that contained narcotic residue. SCHOPFER was placed under arrest and transported to the Loudon County Jail.



Allen Beets, 57, Allison Lane Lenoir City, was charged with Resisting Arrest, Open Container, DUI, and Violation of Implied Consent.

Officer Parmer LCSO, was on patrol when he observed a blue Nissan Frontier at the intersection of Hwy 321 N and Mcghee Blvd. The vehicle was in the middle of the intersection with the vehicle in reverse. 
