

Officer Ketner LCPD, observed the driver and passen-



Deputy K. Palmer LCSO, during routine patrol observed a broke down vehicle at the Eaton Ruritan Ball Park with no one in the vehicle. Deputy observed the vehicle had Knox County plates. Deputy patrolled the area attempting to locate anyone the vehicle may have belonged to. While patrolling the area Deputy pulled into Price Road to a residence that had burned in April and

was unlivable. When Deputy pulled into the driveway he observed a vehicle parked in the driveway.

Deputy. observed feet hanging out the back window. Deputy observed the vehicle had Knox County Tags. Deputy observed a female who appeared to be sleeping in the back of the vehicle. Deputy woke the female up to see why she was in the driveway of a residence that was unlivable. While speaking with the female Ms. Patricia Knight Wilson Deputy could smell a strong odor of marijuana emitting from the vehicle. Deputy asked Ms. Wilson

if there was anything illegal inside the vehicle at which time she stated no. Deputy advised her he could smell marijuana emitting from the vehicle, then she stated there was probably a marijuana roach in the ash tray area of the vehicle.

While searching the vehicle due to the odor of marijuana Deputy located a box with about 30 marijuana roaches. Deputy also located two cut straws commonly used for drug use. Ms. Wilson then stated she had some marijuana in her purse. While continuing his search Deputy located a baggy with about 4.2gm of marijuana. Deputy also located a baggy with 6.3gm's of clear crystal substance believed to be methamphetamine, two glass containers with marijuana, rolling papers, marijuana grinder, and a pipe commonly used for smoking marijuana. Ms. Wilson was placed

under arrest and transported to the Loudon County Jail by Deputy C. Bengel. Deputy Bengel advised Ms. Wilson was moving around a lot in his vehicle and when he got to the jail and searched his vehicle he located a contacts case with approximately 1gm of a clear crystal substance believed to be methamphetamine and a blue cut straw. Deputy Bengel advised he had searched his vehicle prior to transporting Ms. Wilson. The total amount of marijuana found was approximately 20.7gm and the total of methamphetamine was approximately 7.5gm.

Ms. Wilson was charged with man, sell, delivery, possession of Sch6, man sell delivery, possession Sch2. Possession of drug paraphernalia and tampering with or fabricating evidence. This did occur in Loudon County

The clerk also manipulated and/or avoided paying sales tax by declaring vehicles as gifts, thereby falsifying county and state records. In one instance, the clerk sold a vehicle to a mechanic to whom she owed money and allowed it to be registered as a gift to the buyer.

Investigators also discovered that the clerk had misappropriated county-owned assets when she removed office furniture, equipment, and some flooring from the clerk's office space. The clerk did not obtain approval from the Overton County Executive. The office furniture and other equipment was loaded into a trailer and taken to private property.

The results of this investigation have been communicated with the Office of the District Attorney General of the 13th Judicial District.

"Public officials must conduct government business with a high level of integrity," said Comptroller Mumpower. "Falsifying transactions and creating erroneous tax exemptions violate state guidelines and statutes. Citizens expect their elected officials to demonstrate both personal and professional ethical conduct."
