when he Observed a White Buick with an expired registration (E300394) displayed. Officer initiated a traffic stop on Hwy 321 at 75N and made contact with the driver (Monahan) and passenger (Morgan) and immediately noticed the burnt smell of marijuana emanating from the vehicle. Monahan failed to show officers a proof of insurance on the vehicle and a records check revealed him to also have a suspended license. Officers asked both


occupants to exit the vehicle and a probable cause search conducted revealing the following items. A small baggie containing 14, 30mg Oxycodone's, several cut straws containing a powdered residue, small baggies that Monahan admitted to containing Meth, and 2 grinders. Morgan also had cut straws on her person and in her purse. Both occupants were placed into custody and transported to the Loudon Co Jail and the vehicle was impounded by Moneymakers. While at the jail, Officer found a small, torn baggie in the back seat of the patrol car and small pieces of what appeared to be Meth scattered on the seat. Monahan was mirandized and admitted to officers that the small baggie in the back seat did indeed contain meth. While





Sarah Smallwood, Randolph Road Sweetwater, was charged with Mfg Del Sale or Poss. Of Meth, Poss. Of Drug Para., and Driving on Revoked License.

Officer R. Miller LCPD. was conducting a patrol in the area of Highway 321 near Highway 70 in Lenoir City, TN During patrol duties Officer observed a silver in color Mazda sedan traveling south on Highway 321. While observing this vehicle he noticed that the windows on the vehicle were heavily tinted to the point that you could not see into the vehicle.

Officer initiated a traffic stop on the Mazda sedan in the area of Highway 321 and Cut Thru Road in Lenoir City. Upon approach to the vehicle, Officer made contact with the driver Sarah Smallwood, SMALLWOOD appeared nervous throughout the entire traffic stop by not being able to sit or stand still, very fidgety and showed signs of deceptive behavior.

The windows on the vehicle registered at 4% and were checked using my Laser Labs Window Tint Meter, which is an issued piece of equipment through the

Lenoir City Police Department. While speaking with, SMALLWOOD, she stated that she did not have a driver's license and stated that her status was suspended.

Dispatch was able to confirm that SMALLWOOD'S was in fact suspended. While conducting his business in regards to writing citations, Officer requested for Deputy C. Gray and his K9 partner Kora to respond to my location to conduct an open-air sniff of the vehicle SMALLWOOD was driving.

On scene, Deputy Gray and K9 kora conducted an open-

air sniff of the vehicle where K9 Kora positively alerted to an odor of narcotics coming from inside of the vehicle. A probable cause search of the vehicle revealed (0.50 Grams) of a crystal-like substance believed to be methamphetamine, (1) glass pipe believed to be used to smoke methamphetamine with, (1) cut straw and (1) black digital scale. The items were located in the passenger's seat of the vehicle in a green case next to a purse that SMALL-WOOD stated was her. Another glass pipe was located in the back seat.





Special Agent Paula Smith started in the San Francisco Division in 1980. Her early years were challenging. She was often the only female agent on her squad. Her motto was to stick with the work: "Once you do your work, they'd accept you," she said.

While Paula was pursuing her dream at the FBI, her brother was pushing for a spot on a space mission, his own lifelong goal. After a series of setbacks and rejections, Steve Smith was accepted into the space program at NASA and flew aboard Space Shuttle Endeavor in September 1994.

Several months later, he was chosen for a mission to service the Hubble Space Telescope. Even more exciting, Steve would get to perform a spacewalk, the official term for leaving the shuttle and physically being out in space.

Astronauts may take five personal items to commemorate a mission, and Steve knew one item he wanted to take.

"To express my gratifor her great influence as a trailblazer and a person with grit and fortitude, but also to the FBI—I decided to fly this FBI flag," he said.

Paula worked at the Office of the General Counsel at FBI Headquarters at the time, and a colleague who ran the FBI Tour got a large flag for Paula to give Steve.

"Everyone thought would be really cool," said Paula.

On February 11, 1997, the Space Shuttle Discovery launched from Kennedy Space Center in Florida, the FBI flag safely in tow. Steve spent nearly 20 hours in space during the spacewalk—an experience

called "magical."

The shuttle landed on February 21. Tradition holds that every astronauf autographs each personal item that traveled on the flight after landing. The signed flag was originally placed in a special section of the FBI Tour. Today, the flag hangs in the Director's corridor at Headquarters, next to a certificate of authenticity and images from Steve's flight.

The only FBI flag flown in space celebrates its 25th anniversary. The flag hangs in the Director's corridor in HQ. It flew aboard the Space Shuttle Discovery, STS-82, in February 1997. The flag measures 53" long by 66"

wide.

Steve Smith wound up going to space two more times for a total of four missions. He ranks in the top 10 of astronauts who have spent the most time performing a spacewalk. He left the Astronaut Corps in 2003.

Paula's career spanned several field office and Headquarters assignments, and she worked nearly every violation. Paula retired in 2005 as an assistant special agent in charge in San Francisco, tude-not only to my sister the same office where her career started.

Over the seas, she noniced a change in the agent thank this great organization, ranks as more women agents joined-and were accepted. "It's just like a whirlwind, a total opposite. I mean, we were strange when we first came in," said Paula. But seeing more and more female agents throughout her career excited her.

Looking back, Paula and Steve often joke with one another about who had the better career. As with most sibling arguments, this one hasn't been settled.

"For me, it is two of America's best brands," Steve said of NASA and the FBI.


