

Officer Carroll LCPD, was dispatched to a physical domestic at Bell Ave. Upon arrival, Officer spoke with Jason Vincil(offender) who advised that his brother (victim) had bitten him in the face after they got into an altercation. Officer then spoke with victim, who admitted to biting his brother Jason, but

only after Jason had punched him in the mouth. Victim stated that his brother Jason was upset due to the fact that Jason's son asked his uncle victim where his check was from his mother passing away that he is supposed to receive each month victim advised that he told him that his father Jason keeps the check, and is supposed to give him the money, but instead spends the money on himself. When Jason son

told Jason that victim had told him about his father Jason keeping the money, it upset Jason. Jason Vincil came into the house, and started yelling at the victim, and tried to get him to walk outside to fight him. Victim stated that he refused to fight his brother Jason, due to him not being in good health.

The report noted the Victim then stated that his brother Jason did punch him in the mouth, and victim grabbed him, and they went to the ground. 
Mr. Jason Vincil was transported to the Loudon County Jail without any further incident.



sight or accounting training to ensure supporting documentation and records related to the town's finances were properly maintained. As a result, the town's auditor was not able to provide an opinion on the town's financial statements for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2021. The town also did not submit a budget to the Comptroller's Office for fiscal year 2021-

Beginning in August 2020. town officials also failed to require town personnel to keep records of time worked. Although payroll records were inadequate and incomplete, investigators could not conclude that any compensation to town employees was inappropriate.

The Town of Lynnville also maintained a petty cash box to purchase supplies, reimburse employees, and to use as a cash drawer for transactions related to its general and water department funds. The cash box contained informal, handwritten ledgers to account for the use of petty cash; however, there was not a complete accounting of the use of the perty cash since the ledgers were sporadically maintained. Several weeks after the water department manager left town employ-

ment, Comptroller investigators conducted a cash count of the petty cash on hand and determined \$217.10 was not accounted for. Town personnel could not explain this discrepancy:

The results of this investigation have been communicated to the Office of the District Attorney General of the 22nd Judicial District.

"It is disappointing to see that important financial functions were neglected for a significant period of time with the Lynnville town government," said Comptroller Jason Mumpower. "It is ultimately up to the mayor and board of aldermen to ensure that state laws and town polices are followed, and that all financial transactions and other accounting functions are properly documented and recorded."


