

what business he had at the school to which he responded that he used to attend the school and was here to reminisce.



Officer Trey Clemmer LPD, was dispatched to Hardin Street for a 911 misdial. Officer arrived in the area and as he was approaching the house Officer heard screaming and crying noise coming directly from residence and began investigation. Officer approached the porch and heard a female crying and screaming in Spanish to a male subject and then heard a loud noise hit the ground. Officer was then assisted with Officer Luna in making contact with the individuals and a female opened the door.

As they were speaking to the female she was very upset, breathing very heavily and could not speak. After a few moments the female finally started speaking to us stating that her boyfriend is being violent towards her because she told him that he need to quit using drugs or he was getting kicked out of the house. She then explained that while she was telling him that he became angry with her and started grabbing her and throwing her around and held her on the couch and tried putting a blanket on her head so she couldn't breathe.

She then stated to me that he grabbed a gun from his vehicle and was putting it towards his head. After furthering the investigation and seeing visual marks on her neck and upper chest area and furniture moved around in the house.

Officer then placed Mr. Servando Hernandez Diaz under arrest for Domestic Assault and transported him to Loudon County Jail. The above actions did occur in the City of Loudon.



Bryson Mealer, 20, Snodderly Road Lenoir City, was charged with DUI, Simple Possession, Poss. Of Drug Para., and Light Required on Motor Vehicle.

Sgt. C. Rogers LCSO, observed a black sedan pass by traveling South on Hwy 11. After catching up to the vehicle, it abruptly turned on to Allen Rd and pulled in the first driveway on the right. After staying in the area a few minutes Deputy then observed the vehicle turn off Allen Rd back on to Hwy 11 without any lights on. The vehicle traveled approximately 50 feet before activating it's lights. Deputy noted the vehicle also crossed the fog line multiple times before he initiated a traffic stop at Highland Park Drive. Upon contact with the occupants, a strong odor of raw marijuana was coming from the vehicle. The driver, Mr. Bryson Mealer, stated he had a roach in the driver's side door. When asked if there was any more marijuana in the vehicle he stated there is a small amount in the glove compartment. Mr. Mealer was also asked why he abruptly turned on to Allen Rd to which he initially stated his tires where not balanced and he pulled over to look at them. Mr. Mealer later stated he turned off Hwy 11 because he was smoking marijuana while he was driving and that he had smoked in the parking lot before leaving Planet Fitness in Knox County. Deputy did locate a small locked bag that Mr. Mealer advised had marijuana in it. Within the bag was 2 grams of marijuana and a rolling apparatus. Mr. Mealer did consent to SFST/ARIDE testing and did not perform satisfactory. Based on the totality of the circumstances Mr. Mealer was taken into custody for DUI, Simple Possession

and Drug Paraphernalia. Mr. Mealer was supplied and read TN Implied Consent to which he did consent to a blood draw. Mr. Mealer was also cited with Light Law. Deputy transported the offender to the Fort Loudoun ER, where the blood draw was conducted, and then to the Loudon County Jail. Said did occur in Loudon County, TN.

conceal the shortages in various client accounts.

Investigators found no supporting documentation in Porth's files or court files that supported the withdrawals and transfers.

Furthermore, investigators noted that Porth prepared an annual accounting that she filed with the court that did not include the cash withdrawals she had made from the account. This has the effect of misleading the court about the financial condition of the estate to conceal her misappropriation.

The Comptroller's Office investigated this matter under its authority to assist district attorneys general and the TBI in the investigation of private funds if the Comptroller deems the investigation to be in the public interest.

Based upon this investigation, in August 2022, the Wilson County Grand Jury indicted Jennifer Porth on one count of theft over \$250,000.

The results of this investigation have also been communicated to the Board of Professional Responsibility of the Supreme Court of Tennessee.






