Charlotte Thompson, 50, Smallen Road Loudon, was charged with Simple Possession, Failure to Move Over for Emergency Vehicle, and Poss. Of Drug Para.

Officer Eldridge LCPD, initiated a traffic stop on a vehicle on Hwy 321 South at Market Dr. Before exiting his vehicle, Officer looked in his side mirror and noticed that an approaching vehicle was still in his lane and not moving over or slowing down even with his emergency equipment activated. The SUV (BGB7239) passed by his patrol car so close that it would have hit the door if it had been open. Officer quickly pursued the vehicle and initiated a traffic stop in front of the Titlemax and made contact with a female driver (Charlotte Thompson). While looking for her Drivers license, Officer observed a Crack pipe in plain view in the drivers seat the driver was asked to exit the vehicle and detained at that time. A probable cause search of the vehicle revealed Thompson to have 2 glass pipes and a brillo pad (used in conjunction to smoke crack or meth). One of the pipes contained a small, white rock which appeared to be consistent with Crack Cocaine weighing in at 0.12 grams. Thompson was transported to the Loudon Co jail and the drug in question will be sent off to the TBI for further testing. The vehicle was impounded by Malones and this did occur in Lenoir City, Loudon Co, TN.

Protection provided by the current vaccine against symptomatic infection and transmission is less than that against severe disease and diminishes over time, especially against the currently circulating variants. If after 5 days you are fever-free for 24 hours without the use of medication, and your symptoms are improving, or you never had symptoms, you may end isolation after day 5.




