



Deputy Bengel LCSO, responded to Shaw Ferry Rd in reference to a vehicle accident. Before Deputy got in the area, Deputy Billy Pickle LC\$O, made contact with the Offender, Dacota Napolitano, on Turman Dr just off Shaw Ferry Rd. Dacota began acting abnormal and took off in a Ford truck while Deputy Pickle spoke to him. A short time later Deputy located the Ford parked outside Turman Drive with visible red transfer paint and deep gouges in both passenger side doors. Deputy walked up to Ford, which was still running, and could immediately smell a strong odor of raw Marijuana emitting from the Ford. Dacota walked out of the house when Deputy approached

and was belligerent. Dacota was all over the place with his version of the events that took place. Dacota was detained while Deputy gathered information regarding the ac-cident. Deputy Parks arrived to assist and while continuing to speak to Dacota he became increasingly more upset and confrontational. Dacota refused to get into the backseat of Deputy patrol vehicle and Deputy had to force him inside. Dacota was advised he was under arrest for Leaving the Scene of an Accident. Deputy was never able to locate valid insurance on the Ford. Dacota began making statements that he was having chest pains and had a hard time breathing. Deputy called for EMS to check on Dacota. Sgt Smith arrived to assist and a short time later EMS arrived and cleared Dacota. Deputy transported Dacota to the Loudon County Jail where he consented to SFST. Dacota performed poorly. Deputy read the TN Implied Consent Advisement which Dacota originally consented to. Deputy transported Dacota to the ER and once inside, Dacota became disorderly, began causing a scene, and started becoming aggressive with the security officer while Deputy filled out paperwork. Joey Ferrell, 34, Highway 95 Lenoir City, was charged with DUI.

Deputy Billy Lewis LCSO, was dispatched to a reckless driver Highway 321. Deputy observed the vehicle a Silver Nissan Titan with Tennessee Registration BGQ3348 traveling in the middle of Highway 321 towards Blount County with a 4 year old child in the right rear child's seat. Deputy then observed the vehicle travel onto the right shoulder back across highway 321 into the median almost striking the cable barrier. Upon stopping the vehicle the driver Mr. Joey Ferrell stated that he was going to jail because he was drunk. Joey stated that he had consumed four to five Bootlegger beers which contained 10% Alcohol. Joey consented to Tennessee Implied consent but refused Field Sobriety. The child was returned to his custodial guardian. The guardian advised that Joey was not intoxicated when he picked up his son. Joey advised that he just got released from Jail on 8-21-2022 for DUI. Deputy took Mr. Joey Ferrell into custody for DUI and transported him to the Loudon County Jail Without incident. This did occur in Loudon County Tennessee.

bered receipt books were also missing, which created a high risk that additional collections were misappropriated.

Investigators also discovered \$192 was missing from the court clerk's office in city hall; however, because multiple people had access to the cash, investigators could not determine who was responsible for the missing money.

Stacy Mayes left the employment of the court clerk's

office in November 2021. Based upon this investigation, in August 2022, the Hawkins County Grand Jury indicted her on one count of theft over \$2,500.

The investigative report also notes the Church Hill mayor misused city personnel and assets. For example, the mayor and employees used city equipment, the maintenance shop, and city time to work on the mayor's personal vehicles. The mayor also used the city's chainsaw and pressure washer, and he obtained weed killer from the city for his personal use.

"This investigative report includes a number of operational, purchasing, and payroll deficiencies," said Comptroller Jason Mumpower. "The city must take steps to ensure it is retaining adequate documentation for purchases, securing cash, and providing the necessary oversight to ensure policies are followed and city property is safeguarded."




