



Erick Enamorado Santos, 22, 27th Avenue Florida, was charged with DUI, Simple Possession, and Driving on Revoked/Suspended License.

Deputy Kenny Redmond LCSO, was dispatched to the area of 175 northbound near the 69 mile marker on the report of a reckless driver. The caller advised that there was a dark colored truck hauling a U-Haul trailer that was all over the roadway. The caller also advised that the vehicle nearly struck a semi truck and the barrier on the river bridge and was "straddling" the center line. Cpl. Brandon Dishner, located the vehi-cle near the 77 mile marker and conducted a traffic stop. Deputy arrived on scene with Cpl. Dishner. Dispatch advised that the driver of the vehicle, Erick Josue Enamorado Santos (offender) had an ID out Florida and his license was suspended for failure to pay fines and failure to appear in 2018. Enamorado Santos advised that he had left his hotel in Georgia 30 min prior at 0500hrs. Enamorado Santos was taken into custody for Driving on Suspended License.

When asked if there was anything illegal in the vehicle, Enamorado Santos stated, "My job is stressful and drives me to drugs. There is some weed in there." While performing an inventory of the vehicle, there was 9.5 grams of suspected marijuana located in the vehicle, along with 0.2 grams of suspected powder cocaine, a 5 gallon plastic bucket full of ice and glass bottle Modelo

beer, and an open container of Modelo beer in a glass bottle that was still cold. Enamorado Santos was then transported to the Loudon County Jail to perform Standard Field Sobriety Tests (SFSTs) in a safe location.

Deputy Christina Wallen, arrived at the jail to assist with the SFSTs. Enamorado Santos performed poorly on the SFSTs and was charged with Driving Under the Influence. Enamorado Santos was read the implied consent form and consented to a blood draw. Enamorado Santos was then transported to Fort Loudon Medical Center for the blood draw, and the blood draw was conducted. Enamorado Santos was then transported back to the Loudon County Jail without incident.

Deputy Christina Wallen LCSO, arrived at the Loudon County Jail sally port to assist Deputy Kenny Redmond with Standard Field Sobriety Tests (SFSTs). Erick Josue Ennamorado Santos (offender) was read his Miranda rights and asked to submit to SFSTs. Enamorado Santos agreed to perform the SFSTs. During the HGN, lack of smooth pursuit was observed in both eyes. There was a distinct and sustained nystagmus at maximum deviation in both eyes, and there was an onset of nystagmus prior to 45 degrees observed in both eyes. Vertical nystagmus was also observed in both eyes. During the walk and turn, Enamorado Santos was unable to remain in the starting position.

During the first 9 steps, Enamorado Santos missed heel to toe on 8 out of 9 steps and

stepped off the line. Enamorado Santos did perform a proper turn, but missed heel to toe on all 9 return steps and stepped off the line.

During the on leg stand, Enamorado Santos swayed, used his arms for balance, put his foot down, did not keep his leg straight, and did not complete the test. During the lack of convergence test, lack of convergence was ob-


served in both eyes. During the modified Romberg, Enamorado Santos reached 18 seconds and swaying was observed.

During the finger to nose test, Enamorado Santos did not touch the tip of his finger to his nose, but did touch the pad of his finger to the bridge of his nose, his nostrils, and his cheek.

Sean White, 31, Lansing Road Knoxville, was charged with Man/Sell/Del/Resale Sch. II and VI, and Poss, od Drug Para.

Officer R. Miller LCPD, responded to a call of service in regards to a possible overdose at Highway 321 North Room 214 (Econo Lodge) in Lenoir City, TN. On scene Officer was met by the complainant, Sean White. WHITE was able to guide him to room 214 where Officer located a white female on the floor in between both beds of the hotel room. The female appeared to be unresponsive and had a blue and white discoloration to her face and limbs where she was pronounced deceased shortly after by medical personnel. While tending to the female who was unresponsive, Officer observed WHITE grab a black fanny pack from a shelf and attach it to his hip and exit the room in attempts to hide possible evidence. During the investigation, central dispatch, notified officers on scene that, WHITE. had active warrants for his ar-

rest out of both Knox County, TN and Blount County, TN. WHITE was then immediately placed under arrest. A search of WHITE'S person reveled (2.97 Grams) of a pink powdered substance that tested positive for Fentanyl Methamphetamine Compound, (0.95 Grams) of a crystal-like substance that tested positive for Methamphetamine along with a small bag containing a white powdery residue. The Fentanyl, Methamphetamine and bag containing the white powdery residue where all located in WHITE'S sock that he had on his left foot. A search of the small black fanny-pack that WHITE placed around his waist and exited the room with it, while Officer was tending with the unresponsive female reveled, (1) black digital scale, (1) glass pipe with a charred bottom commonly associated with smoking methamphetamine with, several unused 'dime bags" which are commonly used for packaging narcotics for resale and (8) white pills labeled - SC 20 which identify as Sildenafil Citrate

not a controlled substance. WHITE also notified officers that he had a backpack that was located near the stairwell on the other side of the hotel. Officer was able to quickly locate the backpack where WHITE then gave verbal consent to search it. Located inside of the backpack was a white powdery substance that WHITE stated was benefiber which is commonly associated with cutting certain

types of narcotics with. A marijuana blunt was located behind
WHITE'S right ear during the
investigation and also recovered inside of the room was
(15.23 Grams) of a green leafy
substance believed to be marijuana. Both the Fentanyl Methamphetamine compound and
Methamphetamine were tested
using a TRU NARC laser drug
analyzer.



sioner's text message made reference to "my gratuity," and it set a \$60 cash price for the service. By setting a fixed price, he was clearly charging and requiring payment of a fee rather than accepting a gratuity in an unknown or undetermined amount.

The results of this investigation have been communicated with the Office of the District Attorney General of the 26th Judicial District.

Investigators also raised concerns about the Madison County Clerk's Office which directed and referred the majority of marriage ceremonies to the county commissioner. Not only

did deputy clerks show their preference in recommending the commissioner, but in some cases, they would schedule appointments and collect money on his behalf.

"The Madison County Clerk must ensure his staff remain impartial when sharing a list of potential marriage officiants with members of the public," said Comptroller Jason Mumpower. "I'm hopeful this investigation also serves to remind public officials about the state law prohibiting them from charging a fee for a public service unless it is expressly allowed by statute."




