Once behind the Nissan Altima (TN Tag 225-BDYZ) the vehicle accelerated to 59 MPH in a 40 MPH zone "Warning". Upon conducting a traffic stop on the 75 Bridge near the 75 NB

Officer identified the driver to be Cesar Celis. While speaking to Mr. Celis Officer observed him to have blood shot watery eyes, slurred speech and the odor of an alcoholic beverage omitting from his persons. Mr. Celis admitted to having two drinks prior to our encounter, Mr. Celis then consented to SFST. When Mr. Celis exited the vehicle, Officer observed him to be unsteady on his feet, and was swaying back



During the HGN, Officer observed lack of smooth pursuit, distinct and sustained nystagmus at maximum deviation, and an onset of nystagmus prior to 45 degrees in both of Celis's eyes. Mr. Celis was swaying forward and backward significantly during the test. At least 3 inches in both directions. During the instruction phase of the walk and turn, Mr. Celis was instructed several times on how to perform the walk and turn. Mr. Celis could not maintain focus nor perform the test. 2020, he was in possession of not only two firearms but also heroin and marijuana that he intended to distribute.

The defendant qualified as an armed career criminal, which requires a minimum of 15 years up to life imprisonment, and was also designated a career offender under the federal sentencing guidelines. In determining the sentence, Judge Corker found that the defendant had obstructed justice by threatening witnesses with violence. The Court's sentence reflected the defendant's extensive criminal history, the seriousness of the offenses of conviction, and the need to protect the public from the dangers posed by this defendant.

U.S. Attorney Francis M. Hamilton III of the Eastern District of Tennessee made the announcement.

The criminal indictment was the result of a joint investigation by the Sullivan County Sheriff's Office, Kingsport Police Department, and the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives.

Assistant United States Attorneys J. Gregory Bowman and Thomas McCauley represented the United States.

This case is part of Project Safe Neighborhoods (PSN), a program bringing together all levels of law enforcement and the communities they serve to reduce violent crime and gun violence, and to make our neighborhoods safer for everyone. On May 26, 2021, the Department launched a violent crime reduction strategy strengthening PSN based on these core principles: fostering trust and legitimacy in our communities, supporting community-based organizations that help prevent violence from occurring in the first place, setting focused and strategic enforcement priorities, and measuring the results.






