Jose Armando Vazquez, 25, 1st Avenue Lenoir City, was charged with DUI, License Required, and Driving on Roadway Laned for Traffic.

Officer A. Lee LCPD, was dispatched to a wreck on Mcghee Blvd. near Weigles. Upon arrival Officer made contact with Jose Armando Hernandez Vazquez, and passenger. Due to a language barrier, passenger assisted in translation with Jose prior to Sgt. Espinoza arriving on scene. The passenger advised Jose was the driver of the White Ford F-150 and she was the passenger. While investigating the crash Officer could smell the odor of an alcoholic beverage emitting from Jose's breath and person. Officer asked the passenger to ask Jose how much alcohol he had consumed, to which Jose admitted he had consumed alcoholic beverages. A records check through

Central Dispatch revealed that Jose did not have a valid drivers license. In the back of the F-150 Officer located several empty containers of alcohol. Officer spoke with witnesses who advised that just prior to the crash they observed the White Ford F-150 traveling at a high rate of speed on Mcghee Blvd. The vehicle was then observed losing control, nearly striking one of the witnesses before striking a Jeep Cherokee, resulting in disabling damage to both vehicles. 



instances, investigators discovered the former treasurer often requested the second signatory to sign blank fire department checks.

In January 2023, the Marshall County Grand Jury indicted Fred Haley on 90 counts of theft of property under \$1,000, four counts of forgery, and one count of theft of property over \$10,000

"This case is not unique in that the former treasurer was allowed control over receiving collections and making deposits. He also made disbursements, without anyone else reviewing or reconciling the bank statements," said Comptroller Mumpower. "Fire department officials must provide proper oversight to reduce the risk of fraud."




