



Deputy Parks LCSO, observed a silver Chevrolet Impala traveling in excess of 100 mph in a 70 mph zone. Deputy initiated his emergency equipment and attempted a traffic stop on the vehicle around the 80.4 mile marker. The vehicle continued at high speeds until stopping at the 81.2 mile marker. 




