Deputy Brockwell LCSO, responded to Village Square Drive for a Suspicious Person inside BB&T Bank stating he was being held hostage. Upon arrival dispatch notified the deputy that the man inside the bank, identified as Luther Smith, stated that he was being held hos-

tage by another subject outside with a firearm. When Deputy arrived on scene, the subject identified as Benjamin Davidson was sitting in the vehicle that dispatched described. Deputy detained Davidson and conducted a pat down for weapons based on the information that he was armed. They were unable to locate the firearm on Davidson's person and continued our search in the vehicle. While searching the vehicle CPL. J. Sartin located a clear smoking pipe located in the passenger seat and then located a small black lock box containing a clear resealable bag with a clear crystal-like substance inside of it. Lu-

ther Smith stated he was in the vehicle and that Davidson drove him to the bank. When asking both Smith and Davidson about the clear crystal substances, they both stated that it was not theirs. Davidson and Smith were then placed under arrest for Possession of Meth and Possession of Drug Paraphernalia and transported to the Loudon County Detention Facility. This did happen in Loudon County, TN without further incident.


Casandra McDuffie, 34, Duke Lane Loudon, was charged with Driving on Revoked/Suspended License, Mfg/Sell/Poss. of Controlled Substance, Man/Sell/Del/ Resale \Sch. II x2, and Man/Sell/ Del/Resale Sch. I.

Officer Law LCPD, was on routine patrol at Highway 321 North "Kenjo" when he observed a white Cadillac sedan (TN Drive Out QEKBNR6) that was running at the gas pump. Upon further investigation, it appeared to have an unknown individual slumped over the steering wheel, and once behind the vehicle it quickly turned off. Officer then observed a female stumble out of the driver's seat, Officer then conducted a consensual encounter, and identified the female to be Casandra Mc-Duffie. While speaking to Ms. McDuffie, the officer observed white foam around the inside of her mouth, and her to have blood shot watery eyes. After running Ms. McDuffie through dispatch,

they advised she was revoked for DUI, and during his investigation Ms. McDuffie stated she had taken Xanax early in the evening. Ms. McDuffie then consented to SFST, to which Ms. McDuffie did perform satisfactorily. During investigation Ms. Mc-Duffie stated she did have crack cocaine in a purple pill container that was attached to her keys, and possibly Xanax in her purse. Ms. McDuffie was then placed under arrest, during my investigation Officers located 9.40 grams of a brown/gray substance believed to be Fentanyl, 5.81 grams of a white hard substance believed to be crack cocaine, .96 grams of a white crystal-like substance believed to be Meth, and 40 orange capsules which were identified to be Gabapentin. Inside Ms. Mc-Duffie's purse was located (2) \$100, (1) \$50, (16) \$20, (3) \$1 for a total of \$573 which was seized. Ms. McDuffie was then transported to the Loudon County Jail without incident. This incident did take place within Loudon County, TN.

Additionally, hospital leaders can remove one of the most substantial system barriers to healthcare worker wellbeingintrusive mental health questions on hospital credentialing applications. 1, 2, 3 Auditing and changing hospital credentialing application questions removes barriers to care and sends a clear message to healthcare workers that their hospital supports their wellbeing and mental health. The Dr. Lorna Breen Heroes' Foundation developed three simple steps hospital leaders can follow to make it safe for their healthcare workers to seek care.

'Like everyone, healthcare workers deserve the right to pursue mental health care without fear of losing their job because of stigmatizing and discriminatory questions," said J. Corey Feist, JD, MBA, Co-Founder and President of the Dr. Loma Breen Heroes' Foundation, "My sister-in-law, Dr. Lorna Breen. experienced this barrier firsthand, confiding in our family that she was fearful of being ostracized at work if she acknowledged that she needed help. Shortly after, she died by suicide. Sadly, I have heard from numerous families who lost healthcare worker loved ones to suicide who expressed the same concerns as Lorna.'

For more than 50 years, NIOSH has empowered workers and employers, including hospital leaders, with strategies and resources to create sustainable, safe workplaces. Impact Wellbeing builds upon these efforts and speaks directly to hospital leaders to address the operational factors within hospitals that contribute to burnout.

"Although some causes of burnout may take time to address, there are many feasible ways to champion a healthy workforce and hospital system," said Casev Chosewood. MD, MPH, Director of the Office for Total Worker Health at NIOSH. "By identifying and implementing practical operational adjustments, hospital leaders can help healthcare workers continue doing what they do best-delivering the highest quality patient care.'






