

The Justice Department announced today that the city of Chattanooga, Tennessee, has agreed to pay \$32,600 to resolve allegations that it violated the Fair Housing Act (FHA) and the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) by refusing to allow four people with mental health disabilities to reside together in a single-family home in the city under the same terms and con-

color. When I, Officer Mc-Ginnis entered the area traveling south bound on Hwy 321 N, officer passed a white Honda Civic with no lights on, being followed by the complainant. Officer then turned around and attempted to traffic stop the vehicle in question at Hwy 321 N and McGhee Blvd. The vehicle failed to stop and swerved multiple times until ultimately stopping at Hwy 321 N (Arby's). When Officer approached the vehicle he could smell a strong odor of alcohol emitting from the vehicle when the vehicle began to roll backwards, with the driver failing to stop the motion of the vehicle. Officer then entered the vehicle through the drivers window to attempt to stop the vehicle when it struck the front of my patrol vehicle. Offi-

cer then removed the subject, later identified as Mr. Elmer Gomez, from the vehicle and placed him under arrest for driving under the influence. Mr. Gomez had a strong odor of alcohol on his breath, slurred speech while attempting to communicate with officers and blood shot eyes. Mr. Gomez could not perform SFST's due to a language barrier, and was unable to give consent to give blood for testing. After further investigation, it was found that Mr. Gomez did not have a drivers license. nor did he have insurance on the vehicle that he was operating. Officers also found multiple open containers throughout the vehicle. Officer then transported Mr. Gomez to the Loudon County Jail without further incident. 

Clarke of the Justice Department's Civil Rights Division. "This agreement sends a clear message that the Justice Department will vigorously protect the rights of people with disabilities. All Americans, regardless of disability, have a right to fair housing in their communities."

"The U.S. Attorney's Office commends the complainant for sharing their experience to improve housing opportunities for persons with disabilities," said U.S. Attorney Francis M. Hamilton III for the Eastern District of Tennessee. "Further, we commend the city of Chattanooga for cooperating in the investigation and working to reach a resolution that promotes accessible housing in East Tennessee."

"Preventing persons with disabilities from accessing housing through discriminatory housing policies has no place in our society," said

Principal Deputy Assistant Secretary Demetria L. Mc-Cain of the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD)'s Office of Fair Housing and Equal Opportunity. "This agreement sends a strong message that HUD and the Justice Department will continue to work together to enforce our nation's fair housing laws."

Under the agreement, which was approved by the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Tennessee, the city agreed to amend its zoning ordinance to ensure that persons with disabilities are not illegally denied housing opportunities or excluded from participation in the city's services or programs. The city also agreed to pay a civil penalty to the government of \$5,000, to train officials and employees about their fair-housing obligations under federal law, designate a fair-housing compliance officer and file periodic reports

with the department.


The case began when Quality Lifestyle filed a complaint with HUD. HUD referred the complaint to the Justice Department, which conducted an investigation.

The Justice Department's Civil Rights Division enforces the FHA, which prohibits discrimination in housing based on disability, race, color, religion, national origin, sex and familial status. The division also enforces the ADA, which protects persons with disabilities' access to state and local

governments' programs and services.






