



Deputy Davis LCSO, responded to Highway 11 East. In reference to a wreck with injury. Upon arrival, Deputy made contact with the driver Eric Frost. Eric advised Deputy he was okay. Deputy provided aid till EMS arrived on scene. Eric advised EMS he was okay and advised he did not want to go to the hospital. While speaking with Eric, Deputy could smell alcoholic beverage's emitting from Eric's breath. Eric had very slurred speech and had trouble standing while speaking with him. Charles Walden, 44, Vonore Road Loudon, was charged with Aggravated Assault.

Deputies were dispatched to Vonore Rd in regard to an armed person. Prior to arrival Deputies were informed by (Complainant) that her stepdad had threatened to shoot his wife and had weapons in the home. Upon arrival Deputies attempted to make contact at the residence but got no response, a few moments later Charles Walden (Offender) came out of some bushes in his back yard and was detained. Deputy Redmond LCSO, then went to Vonore Road to make contact with (Victim) who had gone to this residence for safety. Deputy made contact with victim who stated that her and Charles were at Cinco's, Charles went to the restroom and in the time period victim received a phone call with upsetting news that made her cry. Charles came back from the restroom and could see victim was physically upset and he thought she was upset

During the drive home, victim was still visibly upset, and Charles again threatened victim that he was going to shoot her in the head if she did not stop. Victim said that made her very scared for her safety so when she arrived home she got in her car and drove down the road to her parents' house for a safe location. Charles did place the victim in a state of fear for her life or severe bodily harm. Charles was then arrested and transported to the Loudon County Justice Center without incident. Upon arrival Charles was searched and he had on his person a magazine with 4 bullets in his pocket which was seized and is being held for safekeeping.

Domestic Charge Filed

Edith Anderson,35, Port Madison Drive Loudon, was charged with Domestic As-

sault. Deputy McVay LCSO, responded to Port Madison Dr., reference a report of a domestic assault. Deputy arrived and contacted the victim, who was seen bleeding from his right thumb. Victim said he had gone to the Carmichael Inn with his children's mother, Edith Anderson, with whom he lives with and they had several alcoholic beverages. They began to argue at the bar so victim left the location and returned home where he went to sleep. Victim was awoken by Edith who was yelling at him, wanting to continue the argument. nally apprehended on the evening of March 7, 2020, at a Red Roof Inn hotel in Knoxville. During a search of Whipple's hotel room and vehicle, law enforcement located over \$4,000 in cash and several items that Whipple used to commit the bank robberies, including a wig and a demand note.

U.S. Attorney Francis M. Hamilton III of the Eastern District of Tennessee; and FBI Special Agent in Charge Joseph E. Carrico made the announcement.

The criminal indictment was the result of a joint investigation by the Knox-ville Police Department and Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). This investigation was led by FBI Special Agent Wesley Leatham.

Assistant United States Attorney LaToyia Carpenter represented the United States at sentencing.




