### **Knoxville Dentist Sentenced To Prison For** Conspiring To Commit Health Care Fraud

Man at Walgreens

Clarence ("Buzz") Nabers, 56 years old, was sentenced to six months in prison followed by six months of home detention by the Honorable Katherine A. Crytzer, in the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Tennessee at Knoxville. Judge Crytzer also ordered Dr. Nabers to serve one year on supervised release, pay restitu-

tion in the amount of at least November 1, \$249,600.02, and pay a fine of \$22,128.

Dr. Nabers, a Tennessee licensed dentist, pleaded guilty to conspiring to commit health care fraud, in violation of 18 U.S.C. §§ 371 and 1347.

As set forth in the written plea agreement filed with the court, during the time of the conspiracy, which began on an unknown date and lasted until

### **Evading**

Maricia Scroggs, 52, White Wing Road Lenoir City, was charged with Immediate Notice of Accident, Leaving the Scene of Accident, Evading Arrest, Driving on Suspended/Revoked License, DUI, and Driving on Roadways Laned for Traffic.

Officer A. Lee LCPD, along with Officer J. Robinson, were dispatched to an MVA in the area of US Highway 321 and I-40 Exit 364. While in the area attempting to locate the MVA, we observed a dark in color BMW run the red light nearly causing an accident at 321 and the I-40 WB exit ramp. Officers attempted to initiate a traffic stop on the BMW utilizing the patrol vehicles emergency lights and siren. The vehicle refused to stop even after attempting a box-in maneuver with the assistance of 9th JDTF, Agent Fritts. The vehicle continued evading

on US Highway 321, onto White Wing Rd., coming to a stop at White Wing Rd. The driver offender, Maricia Alamae Scroggs, was taken into custody. During the pursuit, Officers observed the vehicle failing to maintain its lane of travel. The offender voluntarily waived her right not to speak, or have an attorney present during questioning. The Offender advised she left the scene of the accident and was attempting to drive the vehicle home because she didn't want the vehicle towed. The Offender failed to remain on scene of the accident and failed to notify authorities of the traffic crash. During the encounter Officer could smell the odor of an alcoholic beverage emitting from the Offenders breath and person. Officer observed her to have slow & slurred speech, along with watery eves. The Offend-

er admitted to consuming alcoholic beverages. In accordance with departmental policy, a vehicle inventory search was conducted prior to tow where officers located an open container of alcohol. then advised the Offender of the TN Implied Consent Law, to which she agreed to provide a blood sample for analysis. The Offender was

subsequently transported to the FLMC ER for a blood draw, then to the Loudon County Jail. At the jail, Officer asked to Offender to perform SFST, to which she agreed.

The Offender performed poorly on all tests administered. All the above did occur in Lenoir City, Loudon

County, TN.



David Turner, 38, Homeless, was charged with Public Intoxication, Man/Sell/Del/Resale Sch. I, and Mfg/Del/Sale or Poss. Of Meth.

Officer Sparks, and Officer Martin LCPD, were dispatched to Walgreens on Highway 321 N in reference to a possible intoxicated person. The complainant, a manager of the Weigels at 390 Hwy 321 N, advised that a male entered the restroom inside the business and occupied the restroom for some time. The complainant stated that while inside the restroom for a prolonged period of time, he was able to hear the male inside making "loud

grunting noises". After the male exited the restroom, the manager entered the restroom and noticed multiple syringes inside the trash cans, and advised the male was acting suspicious when exiting the store. Upon arrival, Officer observed a male matching the description given by the complainant standing next to the Walgreens. Upon making contact it was found that the male matching the description was David Eugene Turner.

Mr. Turner advised that he had been inside the Weigels just before walking to Walgreens, and that he did not use any sort of drugs while inside the store. While speaking with Mr. Turner Officer noticed that

he appeared very nervous, and his pupils were very pinpoint. Mr. Tumer was jittering and seemed to be sweating as well. Officer placed Mr. Turner into custody for Public Intoxication given the facts and circumstances.

While conducting a search incident to arrest, a plastic baggie containing a fine, white powder was found inside Mr. Tumer's pocket, which he stated was heroin. Also inside Mr. Tumer's pocket was a pill

bottle containing another clear baggie containing small gray rocks, which Mr. Turner advised was methamphetamine. When weighing the heroin, it weighed approximately 0.7 grams, and the methamphetamine weighed approximately 0.4 grams. Mr. David Eugene Turner was charged with Public Intoxication as well as possession of the heroin and methamphetamine. All of the above did occur in Lenoir City: Loudon County, TN.

number, falsely represented that Dr. Nabers had either personally performed or supervised various dental procedures in his office, including but not limited to Oral Evaluations, Oral Evaluations for Patients under 3 Years of Age, and Comprehensive Periodontal Evaluations. These procedures are required to be performed or supervised by a dentist, and not by a dental hygienist or dental assistant. Dr. Nabers admitted that he had not, in fact, personally performed or supervised the performance of those procedures because he was not physically present at the office when they were Instead, the performed. procedures were performed by dental hygienists or dental assistants when the defendant was not physically present in the office.

This case is the result of an investigation conducted by the Federal Bureau of

Investigation.
