David Dixon, 75, Farmbrook Drive Georgia, was charged with DUI, Violation of Implied Consent, Open Container, and Resisting Arrest.

Deputy Hawkins LCSO, was dispatched to the area of Natalie Boulevard and Highway 11 in reference to a Yellow Chevrolet Corvette parked in the roadway. The caller, was traveling in the area and observed this vehicle in the roadway, the blinker was on and it was stationary. The caller called this into dispatched and remained on the scene until units arrived on the scene. Deputy arrived and also observed this vehicle in the roadway.

Deputy attempted to make contact with the driver, he was asleep with the vehicle running and in park. Multiple times the male driver was told to open the door. He would reply in profanities and flipping units off. As Deputy would tell him to open the door, he would pull on the air vent. Once, he grabbed the gear shifter and attempted to put the vehicle into drive.

Deputy pried the passenger window open and broke it to make entry into the vehicle.

At that time he was removed from the vehicle. While Sgt. Pesterfield was removing him from the vehicle he attempted to close the drivers side door again. He was placed onto the ground and continued to stiffen his arms, resisting arrest. EMS arrived on the scene and cleared the male subject.

The driver was identified as David Dixon. Deputy could smell a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from Mr. Dixon, his eyes were glossy, bloodshot, and he could not keep his balance or consciousness. In the passengers seat was an opened bottle of "Johnny Walker Black Label" whiskey. Behind the drivers seat was also a opened bottle of "Johnny Walker Red Label" whiskey.

Both bottles of alcohol were half empty. Mr. Dixon was transported to The Loudon County Jail. At the jail, Implied consent was read to Mr. Dixon. He replied multiple times, "I'm sorry".





Deputy Watson LCSO. Calloway responded to Circle in reference to an unwanted guest. Upon arrival, Deputies made contact with Ricky Nelson (Complainant, Offender). Mr. Nelson stated that his daughters boyfriend. (Victim) was inside the residence and they had gotten into an altercation. Mr. Nelson made the following summarized statements

about the altercation:

Mr. Nelson's daughter, (Witness) was arguing with her mother, (Witness). Mr. Nelson told the daughter to leave her mother alone and they got into a verbal disagreement. The boyfriend/ victim then stepped in and called Mr. Nelson a "faggot". Mr. Nelson became irate and grabbed victim by the throat and pushed him onto a chair and got on top of him. Deputy placed Mr. Nelson in custody for aggravated domestic assault due to all parties living inside the same residence. Deputy transported Mr. Nelson to the Loudon County Jail without incident. 

Scotty stated he took Gabapentin, Xanax, Oxycodone and a muscle relaxer. Scot-

ty was then read implied consent to which he agreed and was transported to Fort Loudon for a blood draw. Dispatch advised that Scotty had a revoked license for DUI, and the truck is being held for seizure

Scotty was then transported back to the Loudon County Justice Center without incident, all events occurred in Loudon County.





Additional findings related to the Office of Trustee, Circuit and General Sessions Courts Clerk, and the Sheriff's Office.

Polk County operates under the Fiscal Control Acts of 1957, which require the director of accounts and budget to maintain accounting records for funds administered by both the county executive and the highway superintendent. However, the highway department's funds are being maintained by highway department personnel. This significant finding has been repeated over the last 11 annual audits and has not been addressed

"I encourage Polk County officials to work together with the county commission and the county's audit committee to address the issues noted in this report," said Comptroller Mumpower. "It is well past time for the county to implement the steps necessary to centralize the financial operations of the general government and the highway department. Our auditors shouldn't have to write the same finding year after year."
