Rachel Barnett, 41, Pardue Avenue Oak Ridge, was charged with Mfg/Del/Sale or Poss. Of Meth, Simple Possession, and Poss. Of Drug Para.

Officer R. Miller I CPD. was conducting a patrol in the area of Highway 321 South in Lenoir City, TN. During his patrol duties Officer observed a silver in color Toyota sedan with heavily tinted windows traveling south on Highway 321. Officer then initiated a traffic stop on the vehicle in the area of Lenoir City Fencing on Highway 321 located in Lenoir City, TN. Upon the traffic stop the front passengers side window on the vehicle registered at 25%. Once the windows were checked Officer was able to identify the driver, Rachel Barnett, of Oak Ridge, TN. While speaking with BARNETT Officer noticed that she appeared nervous by her body language and vague when answering questions. Officer also noticed an odor of marijuana masked by perfume emitting from the inside of the vehicle. Officer then asked if BARNETT would exit the vehicle so that he could speak with her in regards to

a citation. While speaking with BARNETT Officer asked her about the odor of maripana emitting from the inside of her vehicle at which time she stated that she recently had raw marijuana with her inside of the vehicle. BARNEIT then stated prior to my search of the vehicle that she had a marijuana blunt in her possession and that it was located in the driver's side floor board of the vehicle. A probable cause search of BARNETT'S entire vehicle was conducted. During the subsequent search of the vehicle Officer located (0.71 grams) of a crystal like substance believed to be methamphetamine along with a glass pipe that had a charred bottom. The crystal-like substance and glass pipe were located together inside of BARNETT'S purse. Officer also located the marijuana blunt BAR-NEIT stated was in the driver's side floor board (1.11 grams). BARNEIT was placed under arrest and transported to the Loudon County Jail. While in custody, BARNETT was mirandized where she stated that the crystal-like substance was methamphetamine and that she uses on occasions.





Officer Law LCPD, was on routine patrol when Officer observed a Black Ford F-150 (TN Tag 675-BFRP) in the parking lot of 1104 Highway 321 North (Kenjo's) with tinted windows so dark you could not see inside the vehicle. Upon getting behind the vehicle, Officer also observed the vehicle







Tuberculosis (TB) is caused by a bacterium called Mycobacterium tuberculosis. The bacteria usually attack the lungs, but TB bacteria can attack any part of the body such as the kidney, spine, and brain. Not everyone infected with TB bacteria becomes sick. As a result, two TB-related conditions exist: latent TB infection (LTBI) and TB disease. If not treated properly, TB disease can be fatal.

Symptoms of TB disease depend on where in the body the TB bacteria are growing. TB bacteria usually grow in the lungs (pulmonary TB). TB disease in the lungs may cause symptoms such as

- a bad cough that lasts 3 weeks or longer

- pain in the chest

- coughing up blood or sputum (phlegm from deep inside the lungs)

Other symptoms of TB disease are

- weakness or fatigue
- weight loss
- no appetite
- chills
- fever

- sweating at night

Symptoms of TB disease in other parts of the body depend on the area affected.

People who have latent TB infection

- do not feel sick,
- do not have any symptoms, and
- cannot spread TB to others.











