### Investigation Details a Host of Failures in the Town of Mason

Tennessee The Comptroller's Office has released a lengthy investigation covering nearly seven years of malfeasance within the Town of Mason in Tipton County. The investigative report has resulted in the indictments of former town finance officer the town's human


Former Town Em- resources manager Miployees Indicted for chele Scott. The town's former mayor, who served from 2015 to 2018, was also investi-

The former mayor misappropriated at least \$8,774.43 from the town for her personal gain. This includes improper reimbursements and expenses related to various trips, meals, and other personal expenses. For Reva Marshall, and example, in January 2018 she traveled to

Monrovia, Liberia on a 10-day trip; the town paid for her airfare, hotel stay, visa and passport applications, and immunizations. A former town employee stated the trip was a personal vacation. The former mayor lost her re-election campaign in November 2018.

Former finance officer Reva Marshall received at least \$80,421.89 in improp-

Hollie Zaki, 50, Kelly Lane Lenoir City, was charged with DUI, Violation of Implied Consent, Poss. Of Drug Para., and Contraband in Penal Institution.

Officers with LCPD, were dispatched to the Taco Bell on Hwy 321 for a Welfare check on a female who appeared to be nodding off while in the drive thru line in her vehicle. Officers arrived on scene and observed a female (Hollie Zaki) at the drive thru menu in her vehicle (681BGHW) and appeared to be asleep while attempting to order. Officers woke the female up and asked her to shut off her vehicle and hand her keys over for the safety of the other vehicles in the drive thru. Zaki appeared to be very disoriented, and had a very lethargic, and slurred speech while stating to officers that she was just sleepy. Zaki was asked if she had taken any medication that


would impair her ability to drive and stated that she only took her medicine for her knees. Zaki consented to step out and perform a Field Sobriety Test and also consented to a search of her vehicle. No Nystagmus was detected during the HGN but Zaki did have pinpoint pupils. The Walk and Turn and One Leg stand were both unable to be performed properly due to Zaki stating that her Knee was bothering her and being very unstable on her feet. During the search of the vehicle, Officers found a cut straw, located in the wallet of Zaki covered in a white, powdery residue. Officer then asked Zaki to see inside her nostrils and also noticed a residue inside of the left nostril. Zaki eventually admitted to officers that she has had problems with addiction and currently takes methodone but stated she hadn't in the last little bit. Due to the totality of the circumstanc-

es and the state Zaki was in Zaki stated "No again". Depwhen Officers arrived, Zaki was placed in custody and charged for driving under the influence and transported to the Loudon Co Jail. The paraphernalia was photographed and left in the vehicle which was impounded by Moneymakers.

Deputy J. Bowling LCSO, came in contact with Ms. Hollie Zaki in the sallyport of the Loudon County Detention Center. Officer G. Eldridge with Lenior City Police Department brought Ms. Zaki to jail for Driving Under the Influence. Deputy had anything on her or in her person that was illegal that she needed to tell her about she stated "No". Deputy proceeded with the intake process and told her if she found anything that she would charge her with Introduction Into a Penal Facility. Ms.

uty walked Ms. Zaki into the pat down room and continued with the intake process. Deputy had Ms. Zaki place her feet on the blue foot prints and her hands on the wall so she could conduct a pat down of her person. Note that Ms. Zaki was incoherent at times and started to nod off while standing there while Deputy was patting her down. After Deputy conducted her pat down and logged her personal property herself and Deputy A. Tipton escorted Ms. Zaki into the female change out then asked Ms. Zaki if she room so she could be dressed out. Bowling and Deputy Tipton started with the strip search. 

er wages, benefits, and reimbursements from the town. Investigators found that Marshall submitted timesheets reflecting approximately 2,908 hours of actual time worked; however, she received compensation for 7,000 hours of work. Marshall approved her own timesheets and processed payroll for all town employees until she left her employment with the town in July 2022.

Human resources manager Michele Scott improperly received \$40,622.68 in wages and benefits from the town. Scott's timesheets showed she worked approximately 5,392 hours; however, she received compensation for 7,920 hours.

Both Marshall and Scott also worked full-time for the Memphis-Shelby County School System (MSCSS) while they worked for the Town of Mason. Investigators determined both women double-dipped by receiving compensation from both MSCSS and the Town of Mason for the same hours of work.

Marshall claimed to be working for both entities simultaneously for approximately 812 hours resulting in \$22,642.14 in improper wages and benefits from MSCSS. Scott claimed to work for both entities simultaneously for 264 hours resulting in \$10,242.36 in

investiga-Comptroller \* tors have also questioned an additional \$11,818.67 of questionable credit card ments facilitated by the former mayor, and another \$45,691.81 of questionable and unsupported credit cards transactions and reimbursements by town employees.

The Comptroller's Office continues to have enhanced supervision over the Town of Mason's fiscal condition. This includes ensuring the town maintains a balanced budget; requiring the town to provide monthly financial records and reports to the Comptroller's Office; and requiring implementation of policies to address audit findings.

Based upon this investigation, in March 2023, the Tipton County Grand Jury Reva Marshall indicted on one count of theft over \$10,000, one count of theft under \$1,000, and one count of official misconduct. Michele Scott was indicted on one count of theft over \$10,000, one count of theft over \$2,500, and one count of official misconduct.

The Shelby County Grand Jury also handed down indictments against both women in March 2023. Reva Marshall has been indicted on one count of theft over \$10,000.





DUI ctd. from pg. 4 bunch up the upper part of it to try to hide the small clear baggie with a grey powdery substance in it. Deputies had Ms. Zaki spread her legs like she was going to do the splits and bend over at her waist and place her hands flat on the floor in front of her. Deputy instructed Ms. Zaki to cough hard "three good times". After doing a thorough strip search. Deputy had Ms. Zaki stand straight up and lift up her breast and due to her size Deputy had her lift her excess skin folds up to make sure nothing else was concealed on her person. That was when Deputy had her get dressed and Bowling and Deputy Tipton exited the room. Deputy took the clear baggie to OIC Martin and stated that we needed to call the on call narcotics detective so the grey powdery substance could be tested. Deputy put the clear baggie in a evidence bag and it was sealed. Bowling and Deputy Tipton went to check on Ms. Zaki. Deputy then proceeded to ask her what was in the baggie and she stated " umm I'm not really sure it's probably heroin or something. It's been in that shirt for a while." Deputy asked her how long is a while? When was the last time you changed clothes? She stated " well I change them everyday!" But you didn't see that in your shirt when you put it on? Deputy told her that is hard to believe that it stayed there that long. Ms. Zaki was then placed into holding cell 2 with out further incident. Narcotics detective Ezell was called in and tested the grey powdery substance which it turned out to be 1 gram of Fentanyl. End of report. This did happen at the Loudon County Detention Center




