






### Theft

The Daily Edition inquired about alleged misconduct allegations involving a TWRA officer in Morgan County

District Attorney General Russell Johnson acknowledged that he verbally predicated an investigation to the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation into a situation involving alleged official misconduct by a TWRA officer located in Morgan County. The initial investigation was conducted by TWRA.

TWRA notified the State Comptroller's Office and the District Attorney General of these allegations and the preliminary results of their investigation. General Johnson requested TBI to take over further aspects of the investigation with assistance of agents from the DAG's

office. At this time the Comptroller has deferred the investigation to our office and TRI

General Johnson noted that no charges have been brought at this point. The investigation is ongoing. He further noted that the Morgan County Grand Jury next meets in September.

The Daily Edition has also obtained a copy of the search warrant used in the investigation. Special Agent Luke Webb of the TBI was requested by General Johnson to conduct and investigation on some suspected activity involving a TWRA Officer.




only be getting 2-3 miles per gallon in his state issued vehicle prompting the investigation.


The agents home was search as well and agents found several gas cans both full and empty as well as receipts and log books where he had used his state issued credit card to buy fuel with.

Tony Goddard, 51, Carter Chapel Road Lenoir City, was charged with Mfg/Del/Sale or Poss. of Meth x2, and Simple Possession

Inv. Clay Jenkins LCSO, responded to Carters Chapel Rd in reference to an unconscious male. Upon my arrival, Deputy made contact with victim Tony Goddard in his driveway with his motorcycle on top of him.

Deputy observed Mr. Goddard to be unconscious, purple in the face, and had snoring respirations which are all consistent with a drug overdose.

The report further noted, Inv. Jenkins and Cpl. Christina Wallen then administered 3 doses of NARCAN to Mr. Goddard.

Deputy then searched Mr. Goddard's person and found a small purse in his right

pocket that contained a pill bottle and a used syringe. Inside of the pill bottle was 1 baggy that contained 1.2 gram of a crystal like substance (Methamphetamine), 2 1/2 blue Alprazolam pills with no prescription, 1 baggy with 0.3 gram of an orange unknown powder, and 1 baggy of 0.4 gram of a white unknown powder. After a few minutes, Mr. Goddard became conscious and alert and was then transported to Fort Loudoun Medical Center by Medic #26. Narcotics were seized and then tested which all came back inconclusive besides the Methamphetamine (Scan #2158) and will be sent off for testing. The blue pills were found to be Alprazolam (Imprint B707) which is a schedule IV Narcotic. All of this did occur in Loudon County, TN.






