

The black container contained a small baggy with a white crystalized substance, a blue small baggy with a gray gravely substance, a small baggy with a green leafy substance, a white pipe, a single doilar bill, one Lortab pill, one Adderall pill, and one red cut straw. Timothy claimed

ownership of all drugs and drug paraphernalia. Due to Timothy claiming ownership, and Carmen possessing the drugs and drug paraphernalia, both subjects were taken into custody for simple possession and possession of drug paraphernalia. The white crystalized substance weighed 1.0 grams as packaged on an uncertified scale. The grey gravely substance weighed .3 grams as packaged on an uncertified scale. Deputy seized a Taurus G2C and Grendel Inc P-12 pistols and one pair of Smith and Wesson handcuffs for safekeeping.





Parker Guyton, 20, Gayland Drive Knoxville, was charged with Underage Driving while Intoxicated.

Officer T. LaForce LCPD, was on patrol traveling on Hwy 321 N. Officer did observe a dark colored vehicle traveling on Hwy 321 failing to maintain lane, speeds were repetitively increasing and decreasing, and continuously engaging the breaks. Officer initiated his emergency lights and conducted a traffic stop on

the above vehicle at the T-Mobile parking lot in Lenoir City. Upon making contact with the driver identified as Parker James Guyton. Officer asked Mr. Guyton for his registration and insurance, while he was trying to find his information Officer Law spotted a marijuana bowl in the passenger side glove box, along with 2 THC vape pins in the middle console. Mr. Guyton was asked if he would give consent to a vehicle search to which he agreed. Talking with Guyton

Officer smelled an alcoholic odor emitting from his persons. when asked if he had consumed alcohol, he stated he had drunk a vodka and sprite mixture unknown how many shots as he stated and told Sgt. Bialek that he had drank a corona extra as he was leaving work. Officer asked how long it had been since he had smoked marijuana due to him having glossy eyes and stating he was tired. Mr. Guyton explained he had smoked before he went to work around 2:30 and during work he smoked his THC pen throughout his shift. Guyton was asked if he would perform the standardized field sobriety

test, which he did give consent to perform the test. Sgt Bialek did conduct the test on Mr. Guyton, in which he performed poorly on all the tests asked to preform, also went through a series of ARIDE test. Mr. Guyton did perform poorly on all the tasks. Due to the totality of the circumstances Mr. Guyton was placed under arrest for underage driving while impaired. He did give consent for a blood draw and stated that if they test his blood, it will show high levels of THC. He was transported to the Fort Loudon Medical center, then to the Loudon County Jail.



Merrick B. Garland. "Teixeira is charged with sharing information with users on a social media platform he knew were not entitled to receive it. In doing so, he is alleged to have violated U.S. law and endangered our national security.'

"Individuals granted security clearances are entrusted to protect classified information and safeguard our nation's secrets. The allegations in today's indictment reveal a serious violation of that trust," said FBI Director Christopher Wray. "The FBI and our partners remain firm in our commitment to hold accountable those who endanger our national security and the security of our allies around the world.

"The unauthorized removal, retention, and transmission of classified information jeopardizes our nation's security. Individuals granted access to classified materials have a fundamental duty to safeguard the information for the safety of the United States, our active service members, its citizens, and its allies," said Acting U.S. Attorney Joshua S. Levy for the District of Massachusetts. "We are committed to ensuring that those entrusted with sensitive national security information adhere to the law."

According to the charging documents, Teixeira enlisted in the USANG in September 2019 and has held a Top Secret security clearance since 2021. It is alleged that, beginning in or around January 2022, Teixeira willfully, improperly, and unlawfully retained and transmitted National Defense Information classified as "TOP SECRET" or "SECRET" and or Sensitive

Compartmented which he had reason to believe could be used to the injury of the United States or to the advantage of a foreign nation, on a social media platform to persons not authorized to receive such infor-

According to the charging documents. Teixeira transmitted the classified National Defense Information on the social media platform in two ways. First, Teixeira allegedly accessed classified documents containing National Defense Information from a classified workstation at the Otis USANG Base and transcribed and transmitted the information in written paragraphs to other users on the social media platform. Teixeira also posted images of classified documents to the social media platform, which bore standard classification markings - including "SECRET," "TOP SECRET," and SCI designations - indicating that they contained highly classified United States government information. At least one of the documents containing national defense information was allegedly found in digital form in a particular account associated with Teixeira.

Each charge of unauthorized retention and transmission of national defense information provides for a sentence of up to 10 years in prison, up to three years of supervised release, and a fine of up to \$250,000. A federal judge will determine any sentence after considering the U.S. Sentencing Guidelines and other statutory factors.

The FBI Boston and Washington Field Offices are investigating the case. The Naval Criminal Investigative Service and the Air

Assistant U.S. Attorneys Nadine Pellegrini, Jared C. Dolan, and Jason A. Casey for the District of Massachusetts and Trial Attorney Christina A. Clark of the National Security Division's Counterintelligence and Export Control Section are prosecuting the case.

A criminal complaint is merely an allegation. All defendants are presumed innocent unless and until proven guilty beyond a reasonable doubt in a court of law.






