Shooting

On Tuesday evening around 8pm authorities received a call of shots being fired inside the Walmart on Highway 321 in Lenoir City. Within one minute law enforcement was on the scene. Somehow the shooter managed to elude authorities and likely fled when everyone else was vacating the store.

Authorities are offering a \$5000 reward for any information leading to the arrest and conviction of the person responsible.

Sheriff Jimmy Davis along with LCSO, LCPD, LCFD, 9th DTF, Detectives and the ambulance service responded to the scene and our handling the investigation.

Sources have reported five shots were fired from a weapon into the air at

Walmart prompting the evacuation of the store. Within one minute of the call authorities were on the scene. During the investigation authorities recovered five shell casings from inside the store around the area where the shooting took place.


Video from inside the store as well as area video is being checked to see if they can positively identify the individual responsible and rule out any others.



This study's findings also show that during the study period, sales of prefilled e-cigarettes decreased from 75.2% to 48.0%, while the share of disposable e-cigarettes increased from 24.7% to 51.8%. 

(B) Sixty (60) days from the date the creditor received an actual copy of the notice to creditors if the creditor received the copy of the notice less than sixty (60) days prior to the date that is four (4) months from the date of first publication (or posting) as described in (1) (A); or




