Roberto Gonzalez, 37, Wellthim Place Oak Ridge, was charged with DUI, Leaving the Scene of Accfident, and License Required.

Officer DeLandy LCPD, responded to a dispatch regarding a vehicle that hit a fuel pump and fled the scene at 95 Market on Old Hwy 95. The complainant, who is also the owner of the Market, showed Officer DeLand the damage to the gas pump and provided pictures of the vehicle that fled. The vehicle was a White Chevy with license plate number: BCP0859, which turned into the Trailer Park next door at Old Hwy 95. Officer DeLand found the van in question at lot 57 of the Trailer Park and saw Roberto M. Gonzalez.

sitting on the porch drinking beer with several empty beer cans and 2 empty cases of Bud Lite beside him. Officer asked if he'd just got back from the Market and drove the van. He responded, "Yes". Mr. Gonzalez was unsteady on his feet and had a strong alcohol odor on his person. He admitted to driving the van to buy more beer and hitting the gas pump while backing up. He told me that he was too drunk to drive. So he went back to his friend's house after leaving the market instead of going home. Officer DeLand conducted the Standard Field Sobriety test, which Mr. Gonzalez failed. Mr. Gonzalez also mentioned that he was here illegally from Guatemala and did not have any form of identification. Consequently, Mr. Gonza-

lez was arrested for driving under the influence, leaving the scene of an accident with property damage, and driving while unlicensed. This incident took place in Lenoir City, Tennessee.

The report did not indicate what identification the man used at the store to purchase the alcohol with in the first place since he did not possess a license for the driving and was here illegally.





U.S. Attorney Francis M. Hamilton III of the Eastern District of Tennessee made the announcement

Law enforcement agencies participating in the arrest and investigation which led to indictment and subsequent conviction of Blocker included the Hamilton County Sheriff's Office, Chattanooga Police Department, and the Federal Bureau of Investigation Chattanooga Safe Streets Task Force.

After putting him in the back of his patrol vehicle Officer spoke with a male that witnessed Casey Donley hitting his son. Witness said he tried to stop Casey. Then Casey started towards the witness, and the witness went outside.






