Upon arrival, Deputy: made contact with Gordon Naramore (Offender/Arrestee) who stated he was struck in the back of his head and his ribs with a club. 
Kayla Payne, 40, Country Road Etowah, was charged with DUI, Driving on Revoked Suspended License, Child Abuse or Neglect Endangerment, and Theft.

Deputy L. Hawkins LCSO, was dispatched to the Walmart parking lot to meet with the complainant victim in reference to a stolen vehicle at Ranchero Drive. Deputy arrived on the scene and made contact with the victim. On approximately Tuesday 5/23/2023 victim received a call from a family friend, Kayla Payne. Kayla was requesting to stay at the victim residence because she had no where to go. During her stay, victim allowed Kayla to use a 2017 Kia Soul registered to her husband, who is currently in Peninsula Mental Health Hospital. Kavla used the vehicle on Wednesday 5/24/2023 to pick a friend up and then returned to the residence. After this, Kayla asked multiple times if she could "have" the vehicle. The victim told her "no" every time. On Saturday 5/27/2023

Kayla left the residence at approximately 3:00 am, according to the victim. Around that time, she heard the door open and went to see who was in the house and notice Kayla was gone. The victm did not notice that the vehicle was missing at that time and stated the keys to the vehicle were left on the end table in the living room before Kayla left the residence. On this same Saturday at approximately 6:00 pm, she noticed the vehicle was missing. Victim wanted to give Kayla a chance to return the vehicle and called her multiple times with no reply. Kayla's son, is a 16 year old autistic male. Kayla had not asked the victim to look after her son and left him at the residence with the victim. The victyim advised that she had left him there several other times with no warning. The son advised the deputy that his mother did not ask victim and that he also attempted to contact his mother several times with no answer. On Sunday 5 28 2023 Kayla was booked into The Loudon County Jail by Offi-

cer C. Law with the Lenoir City Police Department on separate charges. Officer Law advised me that when he had contact with Kayla she was driving the 2017 Kia Soul and it was towed by Malones Wrecker Service. Due to the vehicle being located soon after my contact with the victim, the vehicle was not entered into NCIC. Deputy arrived at the Jail to speak with Kayla, she advised that the victim and her son were

lying to cover their tracks. Kayla believes victim was lying because she is scared of her husband and didn't want him to find out she had let Kayla use the car. CID and DCS was contacted in reference to this incident. DCS referral #1438351157. Det. Gammer contacted the sister of the son, and she stated that on 5.29 2023 she will take custody of her brother. All the above did occur in Loudon County, Tennessee.

Natalie Gutierrez,20, Steekee Road Loudon, was charged with, Domestic Assault.

Officer Ingram LPD, was dispatched to a physical domestic at Steekee Rd in Loudon. Upon arrival Officer made contact with the victim who advised the officer her and her aunt, Natalie Gutierrez, had gotten into a verbal altercation that became physical. She advised the officer they were arguing about chores and victim noticed Natalie was recording her and she physically grabbed her phone from her hand. That caused the physical fight to start. They both fell on the ground and the victim was on top of Natalie and Natalie pulled the victims hair. At that point officers arrived on scene and they had been separated prior to our arrival. After speaking with multiple parties on scene, and reviewing a video that was taken during the

altercation, Officer deemed Gutierrez the primary aggressor. She was placed into custody and was given permission to call a family member to arrange a plan to get her items from the residence after she was released from jail. Officer then transported Ms. Gutierrez to the Loudon County Jail without incident. She is being charged with Domestic Assault T.C.A. 39-13-111. This did occur in the city of Loudon.

The rapid assessment team surveyed in-person attendees from May 5-12 about their COVID-19 testing results and healthcare-seeking behavior. Among 1,443 survey respondents (over 80% of the in-person attendees):

181 (13%) respondents reported testing positive for

SARS-CoV-2

Of those who reported testing positive, 52% reported no known prior COVID-19 infection

1,435 (99.4%) of respondents reported at least one COVID-19 vaccine dose


49 (27%) of the respondents who tested positive received antiviral medications

ceived antiviral medications 70% of respondents reported not wearing a mask; the event coincided with a period of low COVID-19 Community Levels, where masking is not recommended in CDC guidance

None were hospitalized These findings underline the importance of vaccination for protecting individuals against severe illness and death related to COVID-19. Nearly every respondent reported receiving at least one COVID-19 vaccine dose, and none of the 181 people who reported testing positive were hospitalized.

Not surprisingly, there was an increased chance of infection the longer participants attended the conference and the more events they participated in. Specifically, respondents who tested positive reported attending the conference on average for all four days, and the risk of infection was 70% greater among those who attended for three or more days versus those who attended for two or fewer days.

Again, the findings of this rapid assessment support previous data that demonstrate that COVID-19 vaccines, antiviral treatments, and immunity from previous infection continue to provide people with protection against serious illness. CDC continues to recommend that everyone ages six months and older stay up to date with all COVID-19 vaccines, including receiving an updated vaccine. COVID-19 vaccines are effective at protecting people from getting seriously ill, being hospitalized, and dying.






