



Deputy Kirkland, was at the Loudon County Sheriff's Office when he was flagged down by victim 1. The victim stated she was at her home at Rudd Rd when her husband. Gary Hamblin, became aggressive towards her. The victim1 stated her husband is very manipulative and has severe health problems so he is very careless and angry about his condition. Victim 1 stated that her husband had pinned her down on the couch and was in her face and would not let her up, victim 1 also stated Gary said he was going to shoot her and then kill himself. At this point, victim 1 and Gary's son, victim 2, came into the room and pushed Gary off of victim. Victim 2 said that Gary then swung at him, and then victim 2 ducked and shoved him back by the throat. Victim 2 was acting in defense of his mother and himself. Gary left the room and then retrieved a handgun and sat in the living room. Theresa Roberts,48, Steekee Street Loudon, was charged with Criminal Trespass, and Poss. of Sch. II.



Allyson Palmer resigned from the PSSD on June 15, 2022. Based on this investigation, in July 2023, she was indicted by the Henry County Grand Jury for one count of theft of property over \$2,500, one count of fraudulent use of a credit card over \$2,500, and one count of official misconduct.

"Credit card purchases should be reconciled with the monthly statements and reviewed carefully," said Comptroller Mumpower. "In this case, administrative staff failed to match or compare receipts to the monthly credit card statements or review the charges for appropriateness before paying the bill."


Fortino Salazar, 42, Dailey Avenue Loudon, was charged with Domestic Assault.





Alex Crawford,21, Vonore Road Loudon, was charged with DUI, Poss. of Handgun while Under the Influence, and Violation of Implied Consent.

Officer Law LCPD, was on routine patrol when the officer observed a black Chevrolet Silverado (TN Tag BJB-1473) driving down the middle of Highway 321. Upon conducting a traffic stop at 390 Highway 321 North (Weigel's), Officer identified the driver to be Alex Crawford. While speaking to Mr. Crawford the officer observed him to have the odor of an alcoholic beverage emitting from his persons, blood shot watery eyes, and a thick tongue. Mr. Crawford stated he had a few beers prior to our encounter at the Cotton eyed Joes in Knoxville. Mr. Crawford consented to SFST, when Mr. Crawford exited the vehicle, the officer observed a half drank Michelob Ultra 12 ounce, and a fully drank Miller Lite 12 ounce in the door. While conducting HGN, the officer observed lack of smooth pursuit, distinct and sustained nystagmus at maximum deviation, and an onset of nystagmus prior to 45 degrees in both of Crawford's eyes. During the walk and turn, Mr. Crawford started the test twice before being instructed to do so. During the one leg stand, Mr. Crawford did not follow directions on how to elevate his foot. Mr. Crawford performed poorly on all tests given and was placed under arrest for DUI. After placing him under arrest, he was read the Tennessee Blood and or Breath Consent Advisement. After reading the consequences, Mr. Crawford refused to submit a blood sample to determine his blood alcohol content. While conducting an inventory of the vehicle, a black Canik 9mm pistol was in the center console. Mr. Crawford was then transported to the Loudon County Jail without incident. All the above occurred in Lenoir City, TN.




