



Pedro Herrera-Solis, 53, Loudon, was charged with DUI, Evading, and No Driver License.

Officer Autumn Ingram LPD, received a personal call from off duty Sgt. Mike Newman regarding a possible intoxicated driver driving through the downtown area of Loudon city. 
Caden Collins, 18, Country Hill Road Knoxville, was charged with Contributing to the Delinquency of a Minor.

Officer H. 




