Ashley Novitzki, 36, Rex Lane Friendsville, was charged with Mfg/Del/Sale or Poss. of Meth, Poss. of Drug Para., and Child Endangerment.

Deputy A. Gann LCSO, observed a white Volkswagon Jetta bearing a Tn tag 564-BJGR failing to main-tain a lane of travel on Unitia Road East heading towards Highway 321. Deputy activated his emergency lights to initiate a traffic stop due to the severity of dangerous driving observed on this vehicle. Upon contact, the deputy met Ms. Ashly Novitzki (offender) operating the vehicle. The deputy also observed a car seat in the back seat of the vehicle not buckled into the seat and sitting free and loose from the vehicle with a bottle in the baby's mouth.

Upon investigation, Ms. Novitzki gave consent to search the vehicle. Ms. Novitzki then stated she was in possession of Methamphetamine inside the vehicle. Ms. Novitzki stated the drugs and a meth pipe could be located in the front pocket of the diaper bag in the passenger seat. The deputy located a clear glass pipe with residue inside and a plastic bag with a clear crystal-like substance was found in the diaper bag sitting on top of the child's tether. Ms. Novitzki was taken into custody and transported to the Loudon County Jail without incident. This did occur in Loudon County, Tn.

Narcotics Investigators tested the clear crystal-like substance and tested positive for Methamphetamine which weighed to be 0.14 grams.

Mark Comer, 41, James Drive Lenoir City, was charged with Domestic Assault x2, and Convicted Felon in Possession of a Firearm.

Deputy C. Bengel and I, Deputy N. Reagan LCSO, responded to a Physical Domestic at James Drive. Upon arrival, deputies made contact with the Complainant/ Victim. The victim stated that she was assaulted while sitting in her vehicle by her wife's boyfriend. The victim said that she left with their three children on July 20, 2023 after a heated argument with the Offender Mark Comer. When arriving back at their residence, she stated that Mr. Comer aggressively exited the home and proceeded to assault her through the window of her vehicle while asking where she had the gun. that she had taken the day prior. The victim said she attempted to retrieve the weap-

on, that was located between her legs. The victim went on to state that she was in fear of her and her children's lives. While Mark was assaulting the victim, the second Victim) struck Mark on the back with her hands in defense of victim 1. Mr. Comer was able to forcibly take the gun from victim 1

The victim and Mr. Comer gave similar statements. While interviewing Mr. Comer, he voluntarily stated that he was a convicted felon. Comer was taken into custody and transported to Loudon County Jail by Cpl. Sartin. After reviewing Mr. Comer's criminal history, it was confirmed that he was a convicted felon. This did happen in Loudon County TN, without further incident.





Jhonatan Roque-Vasquez, 25, Jan Way Lenoir City, was charged with DUI, Violation of Implied Consent, Open Container, License Required, and Financial Responsibility Law.

Officer A. Lee LCPD, was conducting routine patrol on US Highway 321 near Elm Hill Rd when he observed a Silver Nissan Frontier stopped in the straight only. lane of travel, with a left hand turn signal on, despite there being a left hand turn lane available. Officer initiated a traffic stop while the vehicle was still stopped on US Highway 321. The vehicle turned left onto Elm Hill Road and refused to stop until reaching Bussell Ferry Road. Upon contact with the driver, Jhonatan Roque-Vasquez, the officer could smell the odor of an alcoholic beverage emitting from his breath and person.

Once outside of the vehicle, the Offender was unsteady on his feet along with having bloodshot & watery eyes. Lt. C. Dragon responded to the scene to assist with translation due to a language barrier. Lt. Dragon advised the officer that the Offender admitted to consuming multiple alcoholic beverages. The Offender to agreed to perform SFST. Multiple indicators of impairment were observed during the first test. The Offender became uncooperative and refused to complete the other standardized tests. Officers could see in plain view several open containers of alcohol located in the rear floorboard of the vehicle. Due to the totality of the circumstances, the Offender was taken into custody and advised of the TN Implied Consent Law to which he refused to provide a blood sample for analysis. Officers attempted to verify

that the vehicle was insured utilizing the TN Insurance Verification Program. Central Dispatch advised the veconfirmation.

The Offender was subsequently transported to the Loudon County Jail without further incident. All the hicle did not show insurance above did occur in Lenoir City, Loudon County, TN.



by the Tennessee Highway Patrol and caught with a significant quantity of methamphetamine, was released on bond, and was then arrested just over a month later in Greeneville with another large quantity of methamphetamine. Shelton and Crittenden sold methamphetamine to an individual working with law enforcement on five occasions, which led to a search warrant being executed at Shelton's Greeneville residence where a large quantity of methamphetamine was found. The investigation revealed that Tidwell was supplying Shelton with methamphetamine, who was in turn supplying others, including Crittenden.

"The United States Attorney's Office is committed to targeting the ongoing threat to our communities from drug traffickers who bring large quantities of high-purity methamphetamine into our communities," said U.S. Attorney Francis M. Hamilton III. "We will continue to work with our law enforcement partners to ensure that those who seek to profit from flooding our communities with dangerous drugs will face justice."

This sentencing was the culmination of an Organized Crime Drug Enforcement Task Forces (OCDETF) investigation. OCDETF identifies, disrupts, and dismantles the highest-level drug traffickers, money launderers, gangs, and transnational criminal organizations that threaten the United States by using a prosecutor-led, intelligence-driven, multi-agency approach that leverages the strengths of federal, state, and local law enforcement agencies against criminal networks.


Law enforcement agencies participating in the joint investigation which led to the indictment and subsequent convictions in this case, included the Third Judicial Drug Task Force, Greene Sheriff's Office, County Tennessee Highway Patrol, Greeneville Police Department, Johnson City Police Department, Tennessee Bureau of Investigation, Drug Enforcement Administration, and Federal Bureau of Investigation. Numerous agencies from the Appalachia High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area (HIDTA) Task Force assisted in the investigation.


Kim Norman, age 49 of Lenoir City passed away July 26, 2023 at Parkwest Medical Center. She was dearly loved by her family. Kim was a


