## Grand Jury Indicts Nine Drug Cases

Seargant Wayne Bell of the Knoxville Police Department retired from the department in 2019 After Serving Nearly 54 Years. Sgt. Bell also was the origianl 'Eye In The Sky' doing helicopter reports of the traffic in Knoxville for over a decade originally with WNOX and then with WIVK.

Sgt. Bell passed away Tuesday morn-

ing peacefully at his home surrounded by his wife of nearly 60 years Mary and his sons Mark and Dan along with Jessica from Senior Home Assistance.

Family and friends gathered at KPD headquarters in July 2019 to celebrate his service, along with Congressman Tim Burchett. Burchett presented Sgt. Bell

with a flag flown over the capital and thanked him for his service to Knoxville and the Country over his years.

Sgt. Bell also was the liason for AAA when they took the safety patrol students to Washington DC each year leading over 30 buses for years on the trip.

Part of the 32-case docket of the Loudon County Grand Jury included nine drug cases brought by local law enforcement drug agents including the 9th District Drug Task Force, Loudon County Sheriff's Office, Lenoir City Police Department and the Tennessee Highway Patrol. 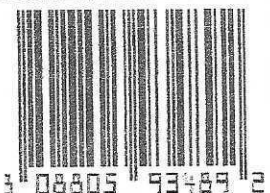

grateful to Sgt. Bell for his commitment and service to Knoxville, and our thoughts and prayers are with his family," KPD said on social media.

Former Congressman Jimmy Duncan also recognized him in 2018 during a House of Representatives meeting for his extensive work in the community. He said Bell was a veteran of the Marine Corps and started his career at KPD as a patrol officer, before supervising the parking ticket division. He later supervised crossing guards and worked at the city's court system under Judge Rosson until his retirement.

Bell is also known for being the original "Eye in the Sky," a program in which Bell delivered traffic reports

from a helicopter as part of a joint effort between KPD and two radio stations — WNOX and WIVK.

"Sgt. Bell earned numerous proclamations and awards for his traffic reports but he is also credited with unraveling traffic snarls, catching criminals and assisting in the betterment of our community. In one especially notable instance, he even landed the copter in the middle of the interstate to stop a chase and saved countless lives in the process," Duncan said about him in 2018.

He is a lifetime member of the Shriners, Masons, Grotto, Royal Order of Jesters, and numerous other organizations. He will be laid to rest this Monday at Berry Lynnhurst Cemetery. Funeral services will be held Sunday.

changing as the organized drug trafficking networks find cheaper ways of manufacturing and marketing ever more potent 'products'. The best example of this is the illegal manufacturing of pills made to look like prescription oxycodone using readily obtainable 'pill presses'. These pills are easier to transport and distribute in large quantities. Furthermore, they are made with dangerously potent fentanyl being manufactured by drug cartels in Mexico using fentanyl from China or using precursor chemicals supplied from chemical manufacturing sources in China and other countries. Whereas, as recently as five years ago a 30 milligram prescription oxycodone was selling on the street for as high as \$60 per pill, these counterfeit pills being sold today that contain poten-

tially deadly fentanyl are going for as low as \$10, or even lower per pill. In mass quantity purchases can be even cheaper per pill.

District Attorney General Russell Johnson notes that fentanyl in any form – powder that is 'cooked up' for use in a syringe to be injected, or even in orally consumed pill form – is still killing users via drug overdose. The number of overdoses resulting in death in Loudon County this year are at 18. Johnson several years ago implemented a 'drug overdose task force' within his office consisting of several ADAs to work with the DTF and local law enforcement drug agents to meet regularly to share information about the suppliers of drugs to those individuals who have overdosed to try and bring Second Degree Murder charges on the suppliers whose illegal drugs result in death.

During a search incident to arrest, officer discovered another tablet in her wallet and seven more tablets inside a prescription medicine bottle with her name on it. Believing the tablets to be a schedule 2 narcotic,

Officer placed her under arrest. Said actions did occur in Loudon County.

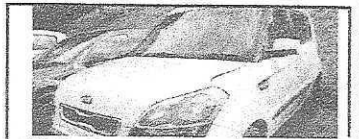

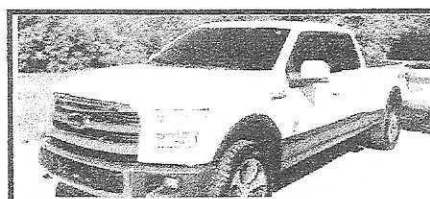

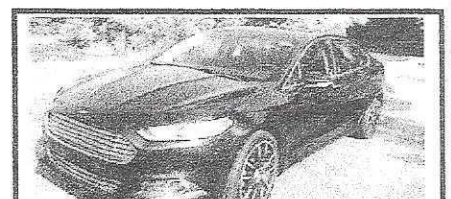
