Tiana Bennett, 23, Industrial Park Drive Lenoir City, was charged with Man/Sell/ Del/Resale Sch. II, and Simple Possession.

Law enforcement contacted a person via text message attempting to purchase 40 fentanyl pills. The person agreed to sell 40 Fentanyl pills for 400.00 dollars and have a female deliver them to an address in Loudon City. The person messaged law enforcement that a female was delivering the pills and that she would be driving a silver Hyundai Sonata. A silver Hyundai Sonata was observed pulling into the meet location and the person messaged that the female was in the parking lot. Law enforcement made contact with the female in the parking lot who was identified as Tiana Bennett. As Agent DeBoer made contact with immediately Bennett she

stated the pills were in her bra and then retrieved the 40 fentanyl pills. Bennett was mirandized and agreed to speak to law enforcement. Bennett stated that she was delivering the fentanyl pills to someone that she knew in Knoxville. Law enforcement asked for consent to search her vehicle and she agreed. Upon searching Bennett's vehicle 11 grams of marijuana was found in her purse. Bennett was transported to the Loudon County Jail.




#### Police Beat


Turner continued by explaining that at the end of the day, the recipe for success is focusing on what you can control and take ownership of—regardless of external pressures.






