



Investigators seeking potential victims of Georgia man charged with sexual exploitation of children

A Georgia man has been indicted on multiple child exploitation charges, and investigators are seeking information from individuals who might have had prior contact with the defendant.

Todd Eric Sisk, 48, of Baxley, Ga., is charged via federal indictment with At-tempted Production of Child Pornography, which carries a

mandatory minimum sentence upon conviction of 15 years in prison, up to 30. He also is charged with Distribution of Child Pornography, Possession of Child Pornography, and Transfer of Obscene Material to a Minor, said Jill E. Steinberg, U.S. Attorney for the Southern District of Georgia.

'We are committed to protecting our most vulnerable citizens,"

said U.S. Attorney Steinberg. "In collaboration with our law enforcement partners, we will strive to keep our children and our communities safe.

After initiating an investigation into suspicious online activity in November 2021, the Walton County, Fla., Sheriff's Office identified Sisk as a suspect and contacted investigators from Homeland Security Investiga-

Brandon Rothgeb, 26, Forest Hill Drive Lenoir City, was charged with, Man/Sell/ Del/Resale Sch. II & VI.

Law enforcement spoke with Brandon Rothgeb by phone and he agreed to deliver Cocaine and Marijuana to an address in Lenoir City. Rothgeb stated to law enforcement that he was passing Campbell Station. A few minutes later Rothgeb and his vehicle were spotted exiting the 81 exit southbound. Officer Andrew Lee traffic stopped the vehicle and observed marijuana in plain view in the vehicle. Upon Officer Lee searching the vehicle he located approximately 5 grams of cocaine and approximately 9.1 grams of Marijuana. Rothgeb was taken into custody and transported to the Loudon County Jail.

Crack

Gregory Nutter, 41, Corryton Luttrel Road Corryton, was charged with, Man/Sell/ Del/Resale Sch.II, and No Driver License.

Law enforcement spoke to Gregory Nutter by phone and he agreed to deliver Crack Cocaine to an address in Lenoir City. Nutter was observed by law enforcement pulling into the location. Nutter stated to law enforcement that he was walking up to the door. Nutter knocked on the door occupied by law enforcement and law enforcement made contact with Nutter. cocaine to a female in Lenoir City. Nutter was taken into custody and transported to the Loudon County Jail.


Christopher Dills, Knob Road Madisonville, was charged with Vandalism, Domestic Assault, and Interference with Emergency Call

Deputy Willis along with Deputy Harrison LCSO, responded to a suspicious person on Sugarlimb Road at the intersection of Sugarwood Road. Upon arrival, deputies made contact with the victim sitting on suitcases on the shoulder of Sugarlimb Road. While speaking with the victim she stated she was ordered out of a vehicle on Sugarwood Road by the offender, Christopher Dills. The victim stated she and Mr. Dills were in an argument in the car because she would not provide Mr.

Dills with gas money. When she threatened to call 911 the victim said Mr. Dills grabbed her phone from her hand and threw it out the window on Interstate 75 between the 74mile marker and the 76-mile marker northbound.

She stated they stopped the car on Sugarwood Road and told her to get out of the car or he would drag her out of the car. Victim stated this put her in fear of her safety so she exited the vehicle and Mr. Dills began to throw her stuff into the street and woods. Deputy did observe multiple pens and clothing scattered in the roadway and on the side of Sugarwood Road consistent with the victim's statement. The victim did provide a written statement to Deputies on the incident.

HSI investigators found suspected child sexual abuse material on Sisk's cell phone and in online applications. Sisk was indicted on federal charges in July, and currently is in custody awaiting further court proceedings.

Sisk works as a truck driver with regular routes to Atlanta and Charleston, with occasional trips to Alabama and Tennessee. He previously lived in Ohio and in multiple locations in Florida and Georgia. HSI investigators are seeking information from anyone who might have had contact with Sisk. Those with information are asked to call the HSI Tip Line at 866-347-2423.

An indictment contains only charges, and the defendant is presumed innocent unless and until proven guilty.

The case is being investi-






