Dean Roberts, 40, Rogers Circle Lenoir City, was charged with Aggravated Assault.


Officer A. Lee LCPD, was dispatched to Cory Drive in reference to a domestic assault. Central Dispatch advised responding officers that a male struck the complainant with a lamp and is now armed with a knife. Upon arrival Officer made contact with the Victim/ Complainant, who advised her boyfriend, Dean Roberts, had struck her in the face with a lamp, pushed her to the ground, and brandished a knife approaching her in a threatening manor. The victim expressed being in imminent fear of serious bodily injury based on Deans erratic behavior after brandishing the deadly weapon. Victim

advised Dean stopped following her with the knife when he realized she was on the phone with 911. The officer observed evidence of iniuries sustained by the victim on her left cheek and left leg. The officer was also able to observe the damaged lamp, and knife used by the offender. The Victim was asked to provide a written statement to which she agreed. RSV is one of the most common causes of childhood respiratory illness and results in annual outbreaks of respiratory illnesses in all age groups. An estimated 58,000 to 80,000 children under 5 years of age, most of them infants, are hospitalized each year nationwide due to RSV infection, with some requiring oxygen, intravenous (IV) fluids, or mechanical ventilation (a machine to help with breathing). Each year, an estimated 100 to 300 children younger than 5 years of age die due to RSV.

"This new RSV immunization provides parents with a powerful tool to protect their children against the threat of RSV," said Dr. Cohen. "RSV is the leading cause of hospitalizations for infants and older babies at higher risk and today we have taken an important step to make this life saving product available."

CDC recommends one dose of nirsevimab for all infants younger than 8 months, born during — or entering — their first RSV season (typically fall through spring). For a small group of children between the ages of 8 and 19

months who are at increased risk of severe RSV disease, such as children who are severely immunocompromised, a dose is recommended in their second season.

Nirsevimab, which was approved last month by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA), is administered as an injection and provides infants and toddlers with antibodies to protect against severe RSV illness. It provides critical protection during a baby's first RSV season, when they're most at risk for severe illness.

Nirsevimab is expected to be available this fall. Expectant parents and parents of infants under the age of 8 months, as well as those with older babies, should talk with their healthcare providers and request this added layer of protection against RSV this season.

ACIP voted to include nirsevimab in the Vaccines for Children program, which provides recommended vaccines and immunizations at no cost to about half of the nation's children. CDC is currently working to make nirsevimab available through the Vaccines for Children program. Healthcare pro-

viders will be a key partner

in CDC's outreach efforts. Additional clinical guidance and healthcare provider education material will be provided by CDC in the coming months.

"As we head into respiratory virus season this fall, it's important to use these new tools available to help prevent severe RSV illness," said Cohen. "I encourage parents of infants to talk to their pediatricians about this new immunization and the importance of preventing severe RSV."


Obituaries




