

passed me crossing over the fog line. Deputy got behind the vehicle, bearing TN registration BCY4199, where it again crossed the fog line, then made a lane change without signaling. While travelling in the left-hand lane, it crossed into the right-hand lane nearly striking another vehicle. Deputy attempted to conduct a traffic stop, just before Lighthouse Point Drive, but the driver failed to stop, only slowing. 




