




Tyler Douglas, 23, Washington Pike Corryton, was charged with DUI, Violation of Implied Consent, Simple Possession, and Poss. of Drug

Officer Law LCPD, was on routine patrol when he observed a black Honda Civic (TN Tag 609-BKXQ) traveling on Highway 321 North with the driver not wearing their seatbelt. Officer then conducted a traffic stop at the I-75 NB on ramp, while walking up to the vehicle, officer could smell the strong odor of burnt marijuana emitting from the vehicle. During my investigation officer identified the driver to be Tyler Douglas, officer observed Mr. Douglas to have blood shot watery eyes, slow speech, and the odor of an alcoholic beverage emitting from his persons. Mr. Douglas stated he had smoked two blunts and drank two beers prior to our encounter Mr. Douglas curred in Lenoir City, TN. then consented to SFST, offi-

cer observed lack of smooth pursuit, distinct and sustained nystagmus at maximum deviation, and an onset of nystagmus prior to 45 degrees in both of Douglas's eyes. During the walk and turn, Mr. Douglas used his arms to balance, took the incorrect number of steps, and used his arms to balance. Mr. Douglas then gave Officers consent to search his vehicle, Officers located in a purple container multiple pipes commonly known to smoke illicit narcotics with, and 7.27 grams of a green leafy substance believed to be marijuana in the trunk. Mr. Douglas was then placed under arrest and transported to the Loudon County Jail. After placing Mr. Douglas under arrest, he was read the Tennessee Blood and/or Breath Consent Advisement. After reading the consequences, Mr. Douglas refused to submit a blood sample to determine his blood alcohol content. All the above oc-



Danny Hooten, 45, Kingscharged with Domestic Assault.


Officer Parmer LCPD, was dispatched to the Exxon, 1111 Hwy 321 N, in regards to a physical domestic in progress. Both complainants/witnesses advised Central Dispatch that a male, was grabbing his wife, dragging her around, and screaming at her and their children. The complainants advised that the subjects left the gas station in a white Chrysler Town and County, bearing TN tag, 434BKBL, headed towards Walmart While in A native of Salt Lake City, the area, Officer observed TN in 1990 where she met the left turn lane at Hwy 321

N and Creekwood Park Blvd. Officer initiated a traffic stop on the vehicle at the EZ Stop, 1103 Hwy 321 N, and made contact with the victim, and the assailant, identified as 45-year-old Danny Hooten. While speaking with the victim, she informed the officer that Mr. Hooten grabbed her by her arms and dragged her around the parking lot. The victim had visible marks on the insides of her biceps which were consistent with Mr. Hooten grabbing her. The officer made contact

with one of the complainants, who advised the officer that he observed Mr. Hooten grabbing the victim, raising his fist, threatening to hit her, and pushing her in the parking lot, all while screaming at her and the children. Due to the visible injuries, multiple corroborating stories, and the totality of the circumstances, Mr. Hooten was placed under arrest for domestic assault. Mr. Hooten was then transported to the Loudon County Jail without further incident.

onies, Alam was convicted of several misdemeanor offenses, including disorderly conduct in a Capitol building, act of physical violence in the Capitol building, and parading, demonstrating, or picketing in a Capitol building.

According to the government's evidence, on Jan. 6, 2021, Alam was among a mob of rioters illegally on the west lawn of Capitol grounds. Alam assisted other rioters in scaling barriers propped as make-shift ladders on the side of the northwest steps.

Alam entered the Capitol building at approximately 2:17 p.m., leaping through a broken window adjacent to the Senate Wing emergency exit doors.

Once inside, Alam spent over 30 minutes roaming different areas on the 4th, 3rd, and second floors. On the 4th floor, Alam attempted to kick in a door. On the third floor, Alam threw a red velvet rope from a balcony at police officers the next level down who were standing guard at the Rotunda doors.


At 2:33 p.m., Alam – wearing a MAGA hat under a black and tan fur-lined hat and a black shirt bearing a red and yellow Pirelli logo – was corralled in the Will Rogers corridor, a hallway connecting Statuary Hall to the House Chamber's Main Door. A line of officers stood guard between the corridor and the House Main Door, which led directly into the House chamber. Alam yelled at officers, laughed, argued with other

rioters, and joined the mob that pushed through the police line.

At 2:41 p.m., after unsuccessfully trying to breach the House Main Door, Alam and others headed to the doors to the Speaker's Lobby-another entry point at the rear of the House chamber. Here, three U.S. Capitol Police (USCP) officers stood guard at the Speaker's Lobby Doors, with furniture piled behind them to provide a barricade. Alam walked up to the officers and looked through the glass of the door, where members of Congress and staff were visibly evacuating the House chamber.

Now at the front of the mob, Alam shouted, "I'm going to f*** you up" multiple times in the faces of the USCP officers who were standing post outside the Speaker's lobby door. Alam moved to the doors, punched the glass repeatedly with his fist, and shattered three glass door panes as members and staff were still present. As he punched the door, Alam pushed up against three officers standing guard. Alam rallied the crowd, announcing that "the problem" was with the House members. Alam then used a black helmet to smash out three of the glass panes. Other rioters yelled that there was a gun behind the door. Officers behind the House Chamber door, who were protecting members, staff. and media still in the House Gallery, drew their guns in response to the crowd, but Alam continued to smash the last glass pane

in the door, enabling a woman to climb through the window, where she was shot.

Upon leaving, Alam called out to fellow rioters that they "need guns."

Alam was arrested on Jan. 30, 2021, in Denver, Pennsylvania. Investigators found evidence of flight and plans to dispose of evidence connecting Alam to Jan. 6, 2021.

Alam is to be sentenced on Jan. 5, 2024.

All charges carry potential financial penalties. The Court will determine any sentence after considering the U.S. Sentencing Guidelines and other statutory factors.

The case is being prosecuted by the U.S. Attorney's Office for the District of Columbia. Valuable assistance was provided by U.S. Attorney's Office for the Middle District of Pennsylvania and the Eastern District of Virginia.

The case was investigated by the FBI's Washington Field Office, which identified Alam as BOLO (Be on the Lookout) #79 on its seeking information photos. Valuable assistance was provided by the FBI's Philadelphia Office's Capital Area Resident Agency, the U.S. Capitol Police, and the Metropolitan Police Department.


In the 32 months since Jan. 6, 2021, more than 1,100 individuals have been charged in nearly all 50 states for crimes related to the breach of the U.S. Capitol, including more than 396 individuals charged with assaulting or impeding law enforcement, a felony. The investigation remains ongoing.


