An investigation by employees one day off Tennessee Comptroller's Office has found that employees within the Polk County Circuit Court Clerk's office received wages and county-paid benefits totaling at least \$123,065.66 for time not worked.

The clerk allowed multiple employees to submit timesheets claiming 40 hours per week; however, the clerk regularly gave

each week. Furthermore, the clerk closed the office for one hour during lunch each weekday prior to January 2022. At the direction of the clerk, the employees only regularly worked 28 hours per week (calculated below).

40 hours (reported hours) - 8 hours (one day off) - 4 hours (lunch off clock) = 28hours

The county's personnel policy states that a full-time employee must work at least 32 hours per week. Fulltime employment is required to receive annual leave, sick leave, compensatory and an option for insurance coverage by the county.

The victim also stated "she was only there to get the kids some clothes". The altercation between Mr. Burnette and victim took place at Lake View Apartments Grove St. Loudon T.N. 37774.

Officers recovered the weapon brandish to the victim which she later identify a the weapon that was brandish to her. Officers arrested Mr. Burnette for aggravated assault.





Seven circuit court clerk employees also improperly received a total of 108.92 of service credits with the Tennessee Consolidated Retirement System. Because the employees were regularly working only 28 hours per week, they were not entitled to receive full-time service credits with TCRS.

'The Polk County Circuit Court Clerk should also discontinue the use of signature stamps in the office," said Comptroller Jason Mumpower. "A signature stamp of a Polk County judge was improperly used by the clerk's office on two expungement orders. Internal controls over the use of signature stamps are inherently weak, and state law does not provide authority for their use.


Man Charged with Burglary

Old Slag Rd where suspect was detained. Suspect stated freely to Officer McMahan that he had been asked to help his friend Brian Brewster move two lawn mowers. The theft had occurred after 2000 and without contact with the owner, who had been at work at the time. The suspect was also a convicted felon and had a small pistol located in the truck. Officer McMahan agreed to write warrants for the Felon in possession of the firearm. Suspect was placed under arrest and transported to the Loudon County Jail by T Branson 974. The lawn mowers were recovered from the traffic stop by the victim. Deputy then went to the McDonald's located at

the intersection of Hwy 411 S and Hwy 72 W, where Deputy spoke to the complainant and witness. The witness provided a written statement and stated that the driver of the sedan had exited his vehicle while she followed them, attempting to get her to lose sight of the truck that had the lawn mowers. 


