Latashua Ingram, 40, Grove Street Loudon, was charged with DUI, Violation of Implied Consent, and Mfg/Del/Sale or Poss. of Meth.

Officer Law LCPD was on routine patrol when he observed a gold Toyota Highlander (TN Tag 292-BHKX) traveling on Highway 321 repeatedly touching the shoulder for approximately a mile to a mile and a half. Upon conducting a traffic stop at 390 Highway 321 North "Weigel's", Officer identified the driver to be Latashua Ingram. While speaking to Ms. Ingram the officer observed her to be profusely

sweating from her forehead while it was approximately 38 degrees outside, and her to have dilated pupils. During his investigation Ms. Ingram stated she had taken her Img clonazepam four hours prior to our encounter. Ms. Ingram then consented to ARIDE, to which she performed unsatisfactorily. During HGN, Officer observed Ms. Ingram he observed lack of smooth pursuit, and distinct and sustained nystagmus at maximum deviation in both of Ms. Ingram's eyes. During the instruction phase of the walk and turn, Ms. Ingram repeatedly kept stepping off the line, and then began the test before being instructed to do

so. During the walk and turn she did an improper turn and used her arms to balance. During the one leg stand, Ms. Ingram placed her foot down twice and used her arms to balance. Ms. Ingram was placed under arrest, after placing her under arrest, she was read the Tennessee Blood and/or Breath Consent Advisement, to which she refused a blood draw.

Ms. Ingram was then placed under arrest and transported to the Loudon County Jail without incident. While at the Jail the officer located approximately .50 grams of a white crystal-like substance believed to be Meth in her purse. This incident did take place within Loudon County, Tennessee, and all the above occurred in Lenoir City, TN





telephone being told they had won a large sum of money even though they had never entered the lottery. In order to claim the prize money, victims were told they had to pay taxes on the winnings first. If the victim fell for the scam, a co-conspirator continued to call the victim for more "tax" money. The number of calls to the victim became more frequent. If needed, the co-conspirator pretended to become the victim's paramour, making the continued requests for additional "tax" money more palatable. The scam did not stop until the victim had no more money, or the victim figured out s/he was being deceived. Sometimes the conspiracy was able to fraudulently obtain Personal Identity Information (PII) from the victim. Armed with the PII, the conspiracy took over the victim's identity and bilked the victim's financial

accounts directly. There were instances when a victim had been bilked of their life savings and that the victim was brought into the conspiracy as a "mule" to receive "tax" money from other victims. The "mule" would be told where and how to send the money minus a nominal fee for his/her trouble. Ultimately, the stolen money was sent to Henry, who took his cut and wired the rest to unknown conspirators in Jamaica.

U.S. Attorney Francis M. Hamilton, III of the Eastern District of Tennessee, and Resident Agent in Charge, Jason Brown, of the United States Secret Service, made the announcement.

The criminal indictment was the result of an investigation by the United States Secret Service. This investigation was led by USSS Senior Special Agent Lesley Cochran.

Assistant United States Attorney Jennifer Kolman represented the United States.
