

Mark Davis, 49, Homeless Loudon, was charged with Violation of Sex Offender Registry, and Establishing Residence Where Minors Reside.

Deputy Davis LCSO, responded to Grandview Drive, in reference to a welfare check for a 14-year-old juvenile advising that he was being assaulted. Upon arrival, Deputy made contact with the juvenile/victim who advised he had not been assaulted. The juvenile stated he was upset because his parents turned off his Wi-Fi. The juvenile later stated his parents also speak to him like a dog. Derputy made contact with the juvenile mother and his stepfather Mark Davis. Mark ad-

vised the jvemile was upset because they turned off his Wi-Fi. Mark stated the reason why they turned off the Wi-Fi was due to the juvenile arguing with his mother. Dispatch later advised Mark was a convicted sex offender. Mark advised he reports to Detective Sargeant Carver in regard to being a sex offender. Sgt. Carver advised Mark has failed to register his home address in a timely manner. Deputy observed his property in the back bedroom of the residence, and it appears that he has established residency at Grandview Drive. Grandview Drive is located within 1,000 feet of a school (Steekee School Elementary School). Mark was taken into custody and charged with Violation of Sex Offender Registry and Violation of

Residential and Work Restrictions. Mark was transported to the Loudon Coun-



Caleb Brannon, 43, Biddle Street Warren PA., was charged with, DUI, Violation of Implied Consent, Driving on Revoked/Suspended License, and Open Container.

Officer T. LaForce LCPD, was dispatched to 983 City Park Dr. Lenoir City Tn. In regards to TWRA Officer C. Hardwick observed a unidentified male passed out in the driver seat of an blue Honda holding an alcoholic beverage in his hand and 3 more empty alcoholic beverage cans in the floor board opened, with the vehicle running and the lights on. Upon arrival Officer Law had the male step out of the vehicle in suspicion of the driver being impaired.

The male was identified by his PA driver license as Caleb D Brannon. 911 Dispatch Center, advised Mr. Brannon was suspended due to a DUI in PA. Mr. Brannon said he had been fishing for a few hours and during that time had consumed 3.5 alcoholic beverages. While speaking to Mr. Brannon the officer could smell an alcoholic beverage odor emitting from

his persons and observed him to have blood shot watery eyes. Mr. Brannon was asked if he would perform the standardized field sobriety test, in which he gave consent to the test. Officer did observe Mr. Brannon to have all 6 clues during the Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus test.

The walk and turn Mr. Brannon were unable to stay in the starting position during instructions, improper turn, incorrect number of steps on the way back and did not count out loud. The last test the one leg stand the officer observed Mr. Brannon to have all 4 clues. Due to the totality of the circumstances and Mr. Brannon being in control of the vehicle, he was placed under arrest for DUI. Mr. Brannon was read the Tennessee Blood and or Breath Consent Advisement and asked after the fact if he had any questions and was given the opportunity to give blood, in which he refused to provide a sample and understood the consciousness if refused. Mr. Brannon was transported to the Loudon County Jail without further incident



> Understand you are not at fault and you are not alone

> Ask for help from a trusted fore sending money or more images. Cooperating with the predator rarely stops the blackmail and harassmentbut law enforcement can

Report the predator's account via the platform's safety feature

Block the predator from contacting you

Report the scheme immediately to the FBI or local law enforcement

Save all interactions; those can help law enforcement identify and stop the predator

If sexually explicit images have been shared, visit the National Center for Missing Exploited Children's and Take it Down tool or Is Your Content Out There? for potential removal

These public service announcements in multiple formats are available to download and share. They are among the resources on fbi.gov highlighting the dangers of financially motivated sextortion and providing options for young adults and teens who fall victim to these online scams.

From October 2021 to March 2023, the FBI and the Department of Home-

land Security's Homeland Security Investigations (HSI) received over 13,000 reports of financial sextortion of minors. The crimes involved at least 12,600 victims - mostly boys-and led to at least 14 suicides during this timeframe. Meanwhile, the FBI is aware of over 20 deaths by suicide resulting from financially motivated sextortion. The offenders are usually FBI etd. pg. 7

located outside of the United States—primarily in west African countries like Nigeria and Ivory Coast or Southeast Asian countries such as the Philippines.

The threat has not abated in the year since the FBI and HSI issued a warning about sextortion, but investigators and victim advocates hope that educating parents and children about the dangers of sextortion—and ways to cope afterwards—can help stem the problem and protect kids.




