

Michael Stokes, 26, Oakwood Drive Lenoir City, was charged with Domestic Assault.

Officers with the Lenoir City Police Dept. were dispatched to Oakwood Dr. in regards to a Physical Domestic. Dispatch advised officers that a female in the residence threw a plate at a 3 yr old kid, then re advised that the plate was instead thrown down on the bed while officers were enroute. Officers arrived on scene and made contact with the caller (Michael H. Stokes) who stated to officers that his girlfriend had thrown a plate of food towards his 3 yr old son. Officers then made contact with victim, who stated to officers that she had tossed the plate of pancakes down on the bed in front of the child and not towards him. Officers did speak to the child in which he corroborated the victim story, saving she tossed the plate down in front of

him and did not throw it at him. An argument between Michael and victim ensued causing victim to break a plate in the kitchen out of Frustration, which resulted in Michael grabbing her on the right side of her head by her hair, throwing her to the ground. Officers did notice visible redness in the area victim referred to. This incident occurred in front of their 5 yr old who did confirm to officers that Michael did grab victim by the hair. It was then determined that Michael was the primary aggressor during the assault and was placed in custody without incident.

While in custody Michael did state that he pulled victim by her hair. Victim remained on scene with the 4 kids at the residence and Michael was transported to the Loudon Co Jail.

This did occur in Lenoir City, Loudon Co, TN. A DCS referral is also being submitted of the incident by the reporting Officer.
