

Charged

Claiborne White Jr., 32, Homeless Loudon, was charged with, Simple Possession x3, Poss. of Drug Para Tampering/Fabricating with Evidence, and Contraband in Penal Institution.

Deputy K. Palmer LCSO, was dispatched to Norwood Street for an unwanted guest. Upon arrival, the deputy spoke with the complainant. who informed him that her child's father, Mr. Claiborne James Jodie White, was at the residence and was found passed out between the cars in the driveway. The complainant had asked him to leave. She showed the deputy a picture of Mr. White in the driveway and mentioned that he had walked toward the Icon Superstore. The complainant also stated that Mr. White appeared to be under the influence of something and might have illegal substances on him.

The deputy located Mr. White at the Icon Superstore at West Hills Drive and noticed that he seemed to be under the influence. When asked. Mr. White admitted to smoking Delta 10 and marijuana. Upon searching him, the deputy found approximately 13 grams of a green leafy substance believed to be marijuana, a glass pipe typically used for smoking meth, half a peach-colored round pill with a partial imprint of 4 75 later identified as Buprenorphine hydrochloride, and naloxone hydrochloride 8mg base 2mg base (a Schedule 3 narcotic), and a white oblong pill with a partial imprint of 65 later identified as Acetaminophen and hydrocodone bitartrate 325mg/5mg (a Schedule 2 narcotic). Additionally, the deputy found a marijuana pipe in Mr. White's backpack.

Mr. White was placed under arrest and put in the back of his patrol car. While in his patrol


vehicle, the deputy observed Mr. White moving around, and at one point, he appeared to be trying to retrieve something from his crotch area with his hands cuffed behind his back. The deputy removed Mr. White from the vehicle and searched Mr. White's hands and the back of his patrol car before placing him back in the vehicle. The deputy advised Mr. White that he would be charged with introduction to a penal facility if he took anything illegal into the jail.

When we arrived at the jail, Mr. White was found in possession of a baggy and expressed concern about getting in trouble for having it. The deputy asked Mr. White where the baggy came from, at which time the deputy observed Mr. White appeared to have ingested something. He later admitted to consuming cocaine to correction officer L. Gault. Upon reviewing the in-car video, the deputy witnessed

Mr. White ingesting a baggy containing suspected illegal narcotics.

The deputy returned to the jail to speak with Mr. White. As he was being removed from the holding cell, correction officers noticed a baggy containing 2.74 grams of a white crystal substance, later identified as methamphetamine. Mr. White was read his Miranda rights and, when questioned, stated to me he consumed mushrooms while in his patrol vehicle. A body scan at the jail revealed the presence of what appeared to be a foreign object in Mr. White's stomach.

Mr. White is charged with simple possession of Schedule 2, 3, and 6 substances, possession of drug paraphernalia, tampering with or fabricating evidence, and introduction into a penal facility. This incident did occur in Loudon County, TN.

perform questionable duties and assigned her a weapon. The administrator was not P.O.S.T. certified.

The Rhea County Angel Tree Toy Drive, which is operated by the sheriff's department, made questionable expenditures totaling at least \$12,124.22

Comptroller investigators also identified several operational deficiencies, some of which contributed to the investigative findings. For example, the department failed to maintain timesheets for all employees and did not always document compensatory time earned by staff.

"The Rhea County Sheriff must hold employees accountable for the pervasive issues in his department's operations," said Comptroller Mumpower. "Not only did employees violate the department's policies and pro-

cedures, but some of these tim who stated that his wife violations also benefited the sheriff and others at the expense of the department. The sheriff should ensure all actions within the department align with the code of ethics and policies.'






