dispatch advising he was behind a black BMW driving recklessly. Deputy Dakota Ezell observed a vehicle matching the description given by the complainant and turned around to observe the vehicle. The vehicle pulled into the Tellico Village Community Church and Deputy Ezell followed to check the welfare of the driver due to the call received. Kathy Lane stopped her vehicle and exited. Deputy Ezell advised her to get back in her car.

Upon approaching the vehicle, Deputy Ezell smelled the strong odor of an alcoholic beverage. He saw multiple empty cans of beer in the front passenger seat. Upon my arrival to the scene, deputy Miller saw Kathy Lane walking around and Deputies Ezell and Watson insisting she stay still. Upon making his initial approach deputy Miller saw that Kathy's eyes were watery and bloodshot. Deputy Miller attempted to conduct Standardized Field Sobriety Tests (SFSTs). After completing the Horizontal Gaze

Nystagmus Test. which Kathy performed poorly, Kathy refused to do the other two SFSTs due to physical limitations. Deputy Watson then conducted Advanced Roadside Impaired Driving Enforcement (ARIDE) Tests. Upon completing all tests, deputies concluded that Kathy performed poorly on all tests. Deputy Miller placed Kathy Lane under arrest for Driving Under the Influence. After completing an inventory of the vehicle, it was found that there was an open 12-pack of Miller Lite beer in the passenger area. There were multiple empty cans and the remaining three cans in the case were cold to the touch. James Wrecker Service was notified and the vehicle was towed. Implied Consent was read to Kathy and she submitted to blood testing.

She was transported to Fort Loudon Medical Center where blood was drawn. Deputy Miller then transported Kathy to the Loudon County Jail without further incident. This did happen in Loudon County, Tennessee.


Mark Pritchard, 35, Melissa Lane Clinton, was charged with, Driving on Revoked/ Suspended License.




Christina Norris, 36, Pearl Drive Lenoir City, was charged with, Domestic Assault, and Public Intoxication.





Means of carrying out the scheme vary, but a common tactic is to direct a victim to a fake investment platform hosted on a website. These websites, and the investment platforms hosted there, are created by criminals to mimic legitimate platforms. The subject assists the victim with openvestment platform.

"The fact these fraudsters and their accounts are typically located outside the United States, will not stop us or our partners at the FBI from doing all we can to recover the proceeds of these frauds and to hold the people running them accountable.








committing fraud with digital currency presents new challenges for law enforcement attempting to recover lost funds," said Special Agent in Charge Carrico. "The FBI along with our law enforcement partners will continue to investigate allegations of crypto scams, but the best defense is to educate yourself before making any investment. Remember, if it sounds too good to be true, it probably is.


Based on data submitted to the FBI's Internet Crime Complaint Center (https:// www.ic3.gov/) in 2022 alone, perpetrators of these schemes targeted tens of thousands of victims in the United States and resulted in over two billion dollars in private assets being siphoned overseas. The loss amount reported in IC3 complaints involving cryptocurrency increased 45% since 2022, from more than \$3.8 billion to over \$5.6 billion in 2023.

The FBI Knoxville Division is investigating the case. The Justice Department's Office of International Affairs and FBI's Virtual Asset Unit are providing invaluable assistance.

The Department of Justice would like to acknowledge Tether for its assistance in effectuating the transfer of these assets. This case is being prosecuted by Assistant U.S. Attorneys Kevin Rosenberg and Rick Blaylock Jr. of the District of Columbia, Assistant U.S. Attorney Joseph DeGaetano of the Eastern District of Tennessee, and Trial Attorney Stefanie Schwartz from the National Cryptocurrency Enforcement Team with the Computer Crime and Intellectual Property Section of the Department of Justice.
