More cases reported in E. coli outbreak linked to Mc-Donald's Quarter Pounders; Taylor Farms recalls onions sent to restaurants

update CDC's Food Safety Alert regarding an outbreak of E. coli infections linked to McDonald's Quarter Pounders has been posted: https://www. cdc.gov/ecoli/outbreaks/e-coli-O157.

Since October 22,

o 26 new illnesses have been reported, bringing the total to 75.

o 3 new states (Michigan, New Mexico, Washington) have been added to the number of states where sick people live, bringing the terviewed, all 42 retotal to 13 states.

o 12 more people have been hospitalized, bringing the total to 22. This number includes the previously reported death in Colorado and child with complications of hemolytic uremic syndrome, or HUS, and I new HUS in an

o The most recent illness on-set date is October 10, 2024.






William Malone. 36. Breezeway Drive Knoxville, was charged with, Mfg/Del/ Sale or Poss. of Meth, Poss. of Drug Para., and General Session Capias.

Deputy Willis LCSO. was traveling South on Old Highway 95 when the deputy observed a Ford Van with no working brake lights. Loudon County Dispatch confirmed the registration had been expired since November of 2023. The deputy initiated a traffic stop at 95 Market and made contact the Driver/Offender William Malone, Mr. Malone showed nervous behavior such as erratic speech and stuttering. Mr. Malone was aware of the registration being expired and lights not working. The deputy ran Mr. Malone's driver's license

through the Loudon County Dispatch for status and local warrants. While still seated in the vehicle the deputy asked Mr. Malone for consent to search the vehicle Mr. Malone hesitated for a minute before answering no. The deputy had Mr. Malone exit the vehicle and accompany me to the front of my patrol vehicle while the deputy started his citation process. While speaking with Mr. Malone he did make the deputy aware that he had a prior narcotic history. Deputy Curtis arrived on scene and deployed K-9 Loki on the vehicle. Deputy Curtis advised that his K9 partner alerted to the driver-side window of the vehicle. Deputy Curtis and Deputy Knight conducted a probable cause search of the vehicle. During the probable cause search, Deputy Curtis lo-

cated a metal tin between the driver seat and center console containing two baggies of what we believed to be methamphetamine. Deputy Knight located two grinders with Marijuana residue as well as a glass pipe commonly used to smoke methamphetamine and a rolling tray with a roller. Dispatch confirmed he had a local warrant for Failure to Appear in Sessions Court of Loudon County docket number 2015-CR-486. The deputy

took Mr. Malone into custody and transported him to the Loudon County Detention Facility for the active warrant, as well as Manufacture. Delivery, Sale, or Possession of Meth and Possession of Drug Paraphernalia. Narcotics Investigators did test the substance via TruNarc and it did test positive for Methamphetamine and weighed 4.7 grams. This did occur in Loudon County Tennessee.





or retailers have been identified as a source of illness.

The specific ingredient linked to illness has not yet been confirmed as the source, but investigators continue to focus on two ingredients in particular: fresh slivered onions, and fresh beef patties.

Taylor Farms, the supplier of slivered onions for affected McDonald's locations, initiated a recall of vellow onions. Stores were contacted directly and asked to remove products. FDA is working closely with the implicated farms and will continue to provide updates including any additional recalls that might be needed for businesses who received recalled onions.

Due to the product actions taken by McDonald's and Taylor Farms, CDC believes the continued risk to the public is very low.

What You Should Do:

If you have severe symptoms of E. coli infection, seek health care, and tell your provider about what you ate.

Businesses should not use recalled onions supplied by Taylor Farms.

E. coli Symptoms:

Most people infected with Shiga toxin-producing E. coli experience severe stomach cramps, diarrhea (often bloody), and vomiting.

o Symptoms usually start 3 to 4 days after swallowing the bacteria.

o Most people recover without treatment after 5 to 7 days.

Some people may develop serious kidney problems (hemolytic uremic syndrome, also called HUS) and would need to be hospitalized.






