Rebecca Aikens, 44, White Wing Road Lenoir City, was charged with Violation of Bond Restrictions.

Timothy Thaxton, 44, White Wing Road Lenoir City, was charged with Violation of Order of Protection.

Deputy Brockwell, Deputy Allen, and Cpl. Wallen LCSO, arrived at White Wing Road for a welfare check. Deputies spoke with the homeowner, Rebecca Aikens (victim/offender), and asked if she was okay due to her being the one we needed to check on. She stated that Timothy Ryan Thaxton (victim/offender) had

been texting her and trying to agitate her all day by texting her about her coming to pick up a truck. She then stated that she was the protected party in an order of protection against Thaxton, She affirmed that she was okay and did not need further assistance. The deputy then went across the street to White Wing Road to talk with Thaxton. While speaking with Thaxton, he admitted to calling for us to do a welfare check on Aikens and also admitted to texting her at 0600 to come and get his truck. Thaxton also showed the deputy the text messages between him and Aikens. Cpl. Wallen contacted the Loudon

County Detention Facility to confirm the Order of Protection was still active and also confirm that there were Bail Bond Restrictions in place against Aikens from a previous assault against Thaxton. Due to there being an Order of Protection in place against Thaxton, with Aikens being the protected party, Thaxton was placed under arrest for Violation of Order of Protection due to him making contact with the Aikens. The deputy transported Thaxton

to the Loudon County Detention Facility. Cpl. Wallen and Deputy Allen then returned to White Wing Road to make contact with Aikens again. She was advised that Thaxton was arrested for the violation of the Order of Protection, but she was also in violation of the Bail Bond Restrictions for her contact with Thaxton. Aikens was then taken into custody and transported to the Loudon County Detention Facility. All of the above did occur in Loudon County.





as to an actor in Lebanon involved in website hosting. Recently released reporting from Microsoft indicates this group has demonstrated interest in election-related websites and media outlets. suggesting preparations for future influence operations.

This CSA provides the threat group's tactics, techprocedures and (TTPs), including its leveraging of online resources related to Artificial Intelligence, and indicators of compromise (IOCs). The CSA also highlights similar activity from a previous FBI advisory that was published on 20 October 2022. This new advisory's information and guidance are derived from FBI investigative activity and technical analysis of this group's intrusion activity against U.S. and foreign organizations and engagements with numerous entities impacted by this malicious activity.

The authoring agencies recommend all organizations follow guidance provided in the Mitigations section to defend against the Iranian cyber group's activities.

If you suspect your organization has been targeted or compromised by the Iranian cyber actors, the authoring agencies recommend immediately contacting your local FBI field office for assistance.
