



Melvin Oliver, 40, County Road Decater, was charged with, Mfg/ Del/Sale or Poss. of Meth, Mfg/ Sale of Controlled Substance.

Officer C. Fine LCPD, made a traffic stop on a vehicle driving with no lights on. During the lawful stop of the vehicle, Officers noticed the odor of marijuana emitting from the vehicle. After asking the driver (Melvin Joseph Oliver) if there was anything illegal in the vehicle, he stated that there was a marijuana roach in one of his packs of cigarettes. The officer then asked Mr. Oliver for consent to search of his vehicle which he agreed to. During a probable cause search of the vehicle officers discovered a meth pipe with burnt

residue wrapped in a bandana under the driver seat. Upon further search, in a red milwaukee backpack in the passenger seat of the truck, Officers discovered three bags of what appeared to be methamphetamine. Also, in the backpack was a separate small red milwaukee bag which contained three bags of a green leafy substance, suspected to be marijuana. There were also documents inside the backpack that had Mr. Oliver's name on them. Mr. Oliver was read his rights, and then asked about the meth to which he stated it was not his, however Mr. Oliver did claim that the cash, paraphernalia, and marijuana were his. The male was taken into custody due to the drugs and paraphernalia and transported to the

Lenoir City Police Department where a Drug Task Force Agent questioned him. After questioning the cash was determined to be Christmas bonus and the money was released to the (girlfriend of offender) by request.

The owner of the truck was notified to which he retrieved the vehicle. Mr. Oliver was then transport-

ed the Loudon County Jail without further incident. Upon tru-narcing the crystal substance it came back as methamphetamine in all three bags. The total weight of meth was approximately 68.56g including bag. The total weight of the marijuana was approximately 36g including bag. This did occur in Lenoir City, Loudon County TN.





A total of \$2,615.99 in taxes or fees were also associated with the questionable purchases noted above.


Investigators also question a City of Sweetwater "employee payback policy" which allows employees to purchase items they want for their job and then pay back the city through authorized payroll deductions. This accounts receivable account (nicknamed the "gun pay" account) included questionable purchases totaling at least \$34,165.66 between December 2014 and June

2023. This practice also increases the risk of error, fraud, waste, or abuse for the city in several areas.

The results of this investigation were communicated with the Office of the District Attorney General of the 10th Judicial District.

"Our investigators have noted multiple deficiencies within they city's financial and business operations that must be addressed," said Comptroller Mumpower. "The city should ensure it has adequate procedures to ensure all purchases are approved, documented, and appropriate. Sweetwater officials must also establish adequate written policies for items like food and gifts."
