



Adrian Patton, 43, Bird Road Lenoir City, was charged with Domestic Assault.

Brockwell Deputy LCSO, arrived at Bird Road for a welfare check. Deputy came in contact with a woman/victim who had apparent bruises on both eyes. Before deputy arrived the complainant, stated that his ex-wife, the victim, had been assaulted by her boyfriend, Adrian Patton. When deputy asked victim what happened, she stated that on January 23, 2024, her and Patton were arguing about him bringing home another girl. The argument then went into the kitchen, and that is when Adrian used a closed handed strike and struck her in the face causing her eyes to bleed and bruise (see images in reference to the apparent marks). After she was on the ground, victim claims that Patton crushed a lighter over the top of her head causing a knot (injuries in

reference to this were unidentifiable). Victim also claimed that he has assaulted her on numerous occasions but never calls the cops because she is scared of him. Before deputy arrived, Patton left the residence, and we were unable to make contact with him. Deputy then spoke to the ex-husband, on a phone call, and he stated that he has proof that the assault occurred. Ex husband provided text messages of Patton claiming to assault victim (see images in reference to the text messages). Victim then called Adrian and during the conversation. Adrian claimed that assaulting her was in self-defense and he was the one being abused in the relationship. The victim was then transported to another residence for her safety. Due to the information provided by the complainant, the information from the victim, and the evidence found, a warrant for domestic assault has been filed for Adrian Patton.


Juan Villanueva, 28, Holyfield Road Gadsden, was charged with Domestic Assault.

found that Berry named himself as conservator and exceeded his authority by controlling \$366,587.76 belonging to the disabled adult and his wife. There were numerous questionable purchases made using this money including restaurant purchases, fuel purchases, various retail store purchases, a loan for a Super Bowl party, and numerous cash transactions.

Berry also made multiple questionable transfers from accounts belonging to the disabled adult and his wife.

Based upon this investigation, in February 2024, the Marion County Grand Jury indicted David C. Berry on one count of financial exploitation of an elderly or vulnerable adult; one count of theft over \$10,000; and one count of violation of the Computer Crimes Act.


