
Timothy Harper, 23, Wexford Lane Knoxville, was charged with DUI, Violation of Implied Consent, and Poss. of Drug Para.

Officer McGinnis LCPD, responded to the area of U.S. Hwy 321 and U.S. Hwy 11 in reference to a crash with out injury. Upon arrival Officer spoke with both drivers and advised them to clear the roadway. Once both vehicles were out of the roadway Officer was able to speak with each driver whose stories did corroborate, stating that Mr. Harper did strike the vehicle in front of him that was stopped with traffic. Upon speaking with Mr. Harper Officer could smell a scent of marijuana on his person, along with Mr. Harper not being able to answer simple questions. There was also a medium size glass pipe with a burnt, green, leafy substance in plain view in the front area of the vehicle. Officer then asked Mr. Harper if he had smoked or

taken any substances prior to driving, to which he informed the officer that he had taken his prescribed Zoloft and smoked THC a couple of hours prior. Mr. Harper then consented to perform STFS's. During the HGN the officer noticed a lack of smooth pursuit, during the WAT the officer saw that Mr. Harper had trouble keeping his balance, and took the wrong number of steps, as well as missing the heel to toe, and made an improper turn. While reading the TN implied consent form, Mr. Harper did interrupt me multiple times, and when I finished reading and asked him for consent for a blood sample he could not make a decision which was taken as a refusal. Expanding CDC's core global health security capacity by building stronger collaboration and partnerships in the East Asia and Pacific region,

The ability to detect public health threats and respond quickly, and

In her new position, Dr. McConnell will formulate a global health security strategy for the region, oversee global health security activities, collaborate on the implementation of head-quarters programs through partnership with CDC country offices, and engage with other relevant stakeholders.
