Kristopher Pierce, 29, was charged with Mfg/Del/Sale or Poss. of Meth, Poss. of Drug Para. and Violation of Probation.

Matthew Underwood, 31, was charged with Mfg/Del/Sale or Poss. of Meth, Simple Possession, Driving on Roadways laned for Traffic, and Poss. of Drug Para.

Deputy Slattery LCSO, observed a black Toyota Avalon with the Tennessee tag of NCH179 traveling westbound on Pond Creek Road, just before Dry Valley Road. Deputy observed the vehicle crossing the left of the double yellow line and returning to his lane of travel.

Deputy conducted a traf-

fic stop on Pond Creek Road (Marathon station). Gas Deputy made contact with the driver, Matthew Underwood, at which time the deputy detected a strong odor of marijuana coming from his person. Deputy then asked if he had his driver's license, and he said it was inside the vehicle. He proceeded to open the driver-side door, at which time the deputy detected a strong odor of marijuana coming from inside the vehicle. 
#### Resisting

Shelly Cable, 54, Inata Trace Loudon, was charged with Domestic Assault, and Resisting Arrest.

Deputy Jackson LCSO, responded to Inata Trace for a possible overdose. Just before arrival, Loudon County Dispatch told the officer that the female had come into the house, and they could hear her yelling in the background. When Deputy arrived, he was met at the door by the victim, and saw that a male, was holding the offender, Shelly Cable, down on the couch. When Deputy inquired about what was going on, Shelly stated that they were beating her, and asked me to look at her face; Deputy saw no signs that would indicate she had been assaulted. The male let go of Shelly, and she began taking her clothes off. The male attempted to stop her from

taking her pants off, and Shelly kicked him off her. She then attempted to kick the deputy but was unsuccessful. Deputy used empty-hand techniques to gain control, but she began to resist. Deputy moved her to the floor where he was effectively able to gain control and place handcuffs on her. After she was placed in the back of his patrol vehicle, victim and the male told the deputy that she had some ongoing mental health issues and had gone to a neighbor's house to drink, and returned home in her current state. The victim showed the deputy his shirt, where she had ripped it earlier, and a fresh wound on his arm, that he stated was from Shelly. EMS arrived on the scene and attempted to assess her, but she was resistive again, and would not allow them to. She was transported to the Loudon County Jail. This occurred in Loudon County, TN.

Brenda Simmons, 70, Alice Avenue Georgia, was charged with DUI.

Deputy Ezell LCSO, was dispatched to the I-75 northbound in reference to a reckless driver. Dispatch stated they had received a call of a gray Nissan Kick with a Georgia license plate (cxx4765) that was all over the road. Deputy was able to locate the vehicle traveling on I-75 northbound. While following the vehicle, he observed the vehicle cross the center line and correct back approximately two times. While in the area of the 74-mile marker, the deputy activated his emergency equipment and attempted to stop the vehicle, however, the vehicle refused

to stop and continued traveling on I-75. While pursuing the vehicle, the deputy repeatedly used his emergen-cy equipment to signal the driver to pull over, the driver finally stopped at the 76.4 mile marker. When Deputy approached the vehicle, he observed a female identified as Brenda Simmons (offender). while speaking to Ms. Simmons the deputy detected the strong odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from her vehicle, the deputy also observed Ms. Simmons to have dilated pupils. Deputy asked Ms. Simmons why she did not stop and she stated that she did not see him. Deputy asked Ms. Simmons if she had been drinking tonight and she stated no, however when

the deputy asked her again she stated she had approximately 2-3 shots before she had left her house at approximately 1800 hours. Deputy asked Ms. Simmons if she would consent to SFST's and she did. When Ms. Simmons exited her vehicle she appeared to be unsteady on her feet. Ms. Simmons was unable to complete SFST's due to her level of impairment. Ms. Simmons was placed into custody and read implied consent and did consent to blood draw. While Deputies were conducting an inventory search of Ms. Simmons's vehicle a large wa-

ter bottle containing a small amount of an alcoholic beverage was discovered on the passenger side floorboard. Ms. Simmons was transported to the Fort Loudon Medical Center where the blood draw was completed, she was then transported to the Loudon County Detention without incident. While at the detention center, Deputy Frye discovered 7 marijuana cigarettes inside Ms. Simmons's purse. All evidence has been logged and the narcotics have been placed in the drug box to be destroyed. This did occur in Loudon County Tennessee.




