Barry Roberts, 50, Foxhaven Drive Kentucky, was charged with DUI, and Violation of Implied Consent.

Officer Parmer LCPD, was on patrol when Officer observed a black Chevrolet Silverado, with an unreadable KY license plate, due to a tinted license plate cover, traveling southbound on Hwy 321 N, with tinted taillight covers that did not allow for the taillights to illuminate properly. Officer initiated a stop on the vehicle at Hwy 321 N and Twin Lakes drive, where he was able to obtain the KY registration, H0J439, and observed the vehicle to have blue headlights and window tint which appeared to be too dark. Officer made contact with the driver, identified as 50-year-old Barry Roberts, and the passenger. Officer removed Mr. Roberts from the vehicle and conducted a tint check; the tint measured at 1%, which is below the maximum tint level of 35%, that Kentucky allows. While Officer. Law was speaking with Mr. Roberts, he observed him to have irregular speech. Mr. Roberts admitted to taking a Suboxone approximately one hour prior to the stop, did not know the time of day, and had pinpoint pupils. Officer Law conducted ARIDE testing on Mr. Roberts. After administering the ARIDE tests, Officer Law stated that Mr. Roberts' eye did not converge, and that he missed 5 out of 6 finger to nose touches. I then conducted SFST's on Mr. Roberts. During HGN, Mr. Roberts showed Onset of Nystagmus prior to 45 degrees. During the Walk and Turn, Mr. Roberts could not keep balance, used his arms for balance, stopped while walking, stepped off the line, and made an improper turn. During the One Leg Stand, Mr. Roberts swayed while balancing, used his arms for balance, put his foot down, and when my stopwatch reached 30 seconds, Mr. Roberts was at 15 seconds. Due to the totality of the circumstances. Mr. Roberts was placed into my custody and read Tennessee Implied Consent, to which he refused to provide a blood sample for chemical testing. Mr. Roberts was then transported to the Loudon County Jail, without further incident.



national security requires more investment in the FBI's capabilities, FBI Director Wray warned lawmakers during a January 31 appearance before the House Select Committee on the Strategic Competition Between the United States and the Chinese Communist Party.

"I do not want those watching today to think we can't protect ourselves," he told legislators. "But I do want the American people to know that we cannot afford to sleep on this danger."

China's quest to steal American intellectual property to gain an economic and militaristic edge over the United States-through nefarious cyber means and traditional espionage, alikehasn't let up. But the scope of its malicious cyber activities has expanded to target our nation's critical infrastructure, Wray told lawmakers

during the hearing, which looked to gauge the risks that CCP cyber efforts poses to U.S. national security.

"There has been far too little public focus on the fact that PRC [People's Republic of China] hackers are targeting our critical infrastructure—our water treatment plants, our electrical grid, our oil and natural gas pipelines, our transportation systems," Wray told the committee during his opening remarks. "And the risk that poses to every American requires our attention now."

China's state-sponsored hackers are posturing themselves to be able to take down these vital resources at a moment's notice. That way, if conflict breaks out between the U.S. and China, they can cripple those resources and do direct harm to U.S. citizens, Wray explained. "Low blows against civilians are part of China's plan," he said.






