

Officer Arden LCPD, responded to Jim Hartsook Drive, apartment H-2 to investigate a domestic assault. Upon arrival officer seen a female crying through the front door and when she answered, officer identified her as the victim. The victim appeared very distraught and her clothing looked stretched and covered in various liquids. The victim stated that her boyfriend and father to her youngest daughter Brady Hatcher had become angry-

The victim stated that Mr. Hatcher began pouring numerous liquids on her and pinned her to the bed by her throat while spitting on her causing her to become scared for her life and children. The victim advised that she was able to run to a neighbor to call 911. Based upon the







tion to the Small Business Administration ("SBA") requesting an EIDL on behalf of a local trucking company. Ghutadaria used the business owner's personal identification information to apply for the EIDL without the business owner's knowledge or authority. The SBA approved the EIDL application based on the fraudulent information provided by Ghutadaria. On June 16, 2020, the SBA \$100,300 transferred EIDL funds into a bank account that Ghutadaria had access to. Between June 16, 2020, and September 2020, Ghutadaria spent approximately all the EIDL funds to pay off student loans, to pay off a motor vehicle loan, and on other personal items.

U.S. Attorney Francis M. Hamilton III of the Eastern District of Tennessee and United States Secret Service ("USSS") Resident Agent in

Charge, Jason Brown, made the announcement.

The case was investigated by Special Agent Thomas Whitehead of the USSS.

Assistant United States Attorneys Mac Heavener and Ryan Blackwell represented the United States





(B) Sixty (60) days from the date the creditor received an actual copy of the notice to creditors if the creditor received the copy of the notice less than sixty (60) days prior to the date that is four (4) months from the date of first publication (or posting) as described in (1) (A); or

(2) Twelve (12) months from the decedent's date of death.




