Former Greeneville Dance Team Booster **Treasurer Stole Thousands**

An investigation by the Tennessee Comptroller's Office has resulted in the indictment of Kimberly Brown, the former treasurer of the School Greeneville Corpora-Support tion's Dance Team Booster Club. The dance team booster club supported the Greeneville Middle and High School dance teams.

Comptroller investigators determined that Brown misappropriated at least \$6,079.79 from the booster club from September 2021 November through 2022.

Most of the money was stolen when Brown wrote reimbursement checks to herself and a family member totaling at least \$5,669.79. Brown admitted that much of this money was used to pay person-

al medical bills.

Brown attempted to explain her reimbursement payments by presenting investigators with three fabricated sales orders and one fabricated invoice as justification. Investigators confirmed with club vendors that the documents were not valid.

Upon arriving a woman was standing in front of a small home or shed in the next driveway down at Waller Ferry Road. The woman stated she had been the one to fire the gun. The deputy could see a male seated in the home directly inside the doorway. The deputy detained both parties in the home. The deputy found the female to be Jennifer Bivens and the male. They both stated they were tired of what they know is "drug deals" going on in the the

drive way in front of their home leading to their neighbors house. They both stated they had been woke up every night by loud cars In the drive way intentionally racing their engines. Tonight they stated the neighbors at had come into their shared drive way and were intentionally racing the cars engine. Mr. Bivens had gone out side and started yelling at the neighbors in the car. The vehicle had stopped and started to back up. Mrs. Bivens stated she felt they were coming back to fight so she fired her gun in the air. The neighbors the victim 1 and victim 2 stated they had come over to the house on the shared driveway to help victim 3 work on a vehicle. The three were leaving after having warmed up victim 3 vehicle. Victim 3 heard Mr. Bivens velling when he drove by so

he had stopped and backed up to find out what he wanted. Victim 1 states she then saw Mrs. Bivens brandish a fire arm and discharge it in the direction of the vehicle and the occupants. All three occupants stated this did put them in fear of there life or serious bodily injury. Mrs. Bivens was taken into Custody and transported to the Loudon County Jail.


Jonas Morales, 23, Coulter Street Loudon, was charged with DUI

WATER SYSTEM FLUSHING PROGRAM

The Lenoir City Utilities Board (LCUB) and Lenoir City Fire Department will be conducting our semi-annual water distribution system wide flushing program per Tennessee Department of Environment & Conservation Water Quality Control Requirements. The Flushing Program will occur for LCUB customers on Sunday, April 14, 2024, from 6:00 p.m. until 2:00 a.m. thru Saturday, April 20, 2024, until 3:00 p.m. The program goals are to identify problems in the water system and ultimately have them corrected. When fire hydrants are flowed, iron deposits in the water lines become agitated. This may cause a brown discoloration to the water in the area which is being flushed. This condition is only temporary and will normally correct itself in a number of hours. During this period of flushing, LCUB recommends that you flow your cold water prior to use to determine if there is any discoloration. While the water is still safe for consumption, we recommend not laundering white clothes without first testing the water for discoloration. If your water is discolored, it will clear up on its own under normal usage over a period of time. It is also best to limit the use of your hot water until the water flows clear as this will keep the iron deposits from going into your water heater. You may also notice a drop in water pressure during these times; however, the water pressure should return to normal within a short period of time. If you continue to experience difficulty with your water pressure or continue to have discoloration of water on Monday, April 29, 2024, please contact LCUB at 1-844-OUR-LCUB (687-5282) to report the problem.

Jail and the vehicle was impounded by Malone's. This did Co, TN


