

HCSN surplus property for sale on Gov Deals, he undervalued the assets. Woodbury received a total of \$2,304.33 through the sales; however, the surplus property was valued by HCSN officials at \$12,374.68.

Woodbury stated he also sold personal items and items taken from HCSN dumpsters through the unauthorized Gov Deals account.

Andrew Woodbury was suspended on February 24, 2022, and his employment was terminated on April 29, 2022. Based upon this investigation, in February 2024, the Hamilton County Grand Jury indicted Woodbury for one count of theft of propof forgery, one count of misrepresenting information to a state auditor, and one count of official misconduct.

"School leaders must ensure they provide adequate oversight over their processes for disposing of surplus property," said Comptroller

Mumpower. "This includes erty over \$2,500, one count making sure all signatures on authorization forms are proper and reconciliations are performed to confirm all proceeds from sales are properly collected, accounted for, and deposited."






